

AMENDMENT TO THE CHARTER of the COVINGTON BANK & TRUST COMPANY.

United States of America, State of Louisiana, Parish of St. Tammany.

Be it known that on this 9th day of January, A. D., 1917, before me, Thos. M. Burns, a Notary Public, duly qualified in and for the parish and State aforesaid, and in the presence of the witnesses hereinafter named and undersigned, personally came and appeared:

1. E. G. Davis, President, and, 2. Robert H. Dutsch, Cashier, of the Covington Bank & Trust Company, who declared that at a general meeting of the stockholders of the Covington Bank & Trust Company, duly convened at its banking house, in the town of Covington, Louisiana, on January 9, 1917, after due notice of said meeting had been given by publication in The St. Tammany Farmer, a newspaper published in the parish of St. Tammany, for and during thirty days continuously preceding said meeting; that due written notice to each stockholder of said corporation had also been seasonably mailed to him at his postoffice; that both of said notices set out the said purposes and objects, as well as the time and place of said meeting; that the same had been read for the purpose of amending Article V of the Amended Charter of the Covington Bank & Trust Company.

That on the above said date the meeting convened, and there was present or represented, more than two-thirds of the capital stock of said corporation, and by a vote of more than two-thirds of the capital stock, Article V of the Amended Charter of the Covington Bank & Trust Company was amended, so as to be made to read as follows:

ARTICLE V.

"Its affairs shall be managed by a Board of Directors, consisting of not less than nine (9) nor more than fifteen (15) shareholders, five (5) of whom shall constitute a quorum to do business; the number of the Board shall be fixed, from time to time, by the Board of Directors; that the Board of Directors be elected on the second Tuesday in January, 1917, and on the same date each year thereafter, there shall be elected a Board of Directors annually. The election shall be by ballot and conducted by three (3) commissioners, appointed by the Board of Directors. Notice of such election shall be given by publication, not less than ten (10) days prior to such election, in one of the newspapers published in the town of Covington. Each holder of stock shall be entitled to one vote for each share of stock standing in his name on the books of the Bank, to be cast in person or by proxy, and the majority of the votes cast shall elect.

Any vacancy on the Board of Directors, shall be filled by the remaining Directors. A failure to elect Directors on the above date specified shall not dissolve the corporation, but the Directors then in office shall remain in office until their successors are elected and qualified, and shall cause another election to be held as soon as possible thereafter, after notice has been published as above provided. The first Board of Directors elected under this Amended Charter and the Boards thereafter elected, shall elect from their own number by ballot, a President, and as many Vice-Presidents as the by-laws shall direct. Said Board of Directors may appoint from time to time, such officers, agents, or clerks and other employees as they may deem necessary for the purpose and business of said corporation, who shall hold office at the pleasure of the Board of Directors. The said Board of Directors may make and establish, as well as alter and amend, any such by-laws, rules and regulations, necessary and proper for the conduct and management of the business and affairs of said corporation. All the powers of this corporation are hereby vested in the Board of Directors, except those specially reserved by law and by this charter to the stockholders. The Cashier appointed by the Board of Directors shall be custodian of the seal on which shall be engraved 'COVINGTON BANK & TRUST COMPANY, Corporation Seal, Covington, La.'

Brewster and Warren Thomas, both competent witnesses, residing in the Parish of St. Tammany, who have hereunto signed their names with the said applicants, and me, Notary, after due reading of the whole.
