

**PROCLAMATION.**

Pursuant to a resolution passed by the St. Tammany La., Parish School Board at its regular meeting on the fifth day of January, 1917, I, N. H. Fitzsimons, President of said Parish School Board, hereby give notice that, in compliance with said resolution, a special election will be held in School District No. 4 of the parish of St. Tammany, La., on the second day of April, 1917, for the purpose of submitting to the property taxpayers qualified under the constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana to vote at said election, the following propositions, to-wit:

**Proposition No. 1.**  
To levy a special tax of three (3) mills on the dollar on all property in School District No. 4 of the parish of St. Tammany, La., subject to state taxation, annually, for a period of ten years, for the purpose of giving additional aid to the public schools of said school district No. 4.

**Proposition No. 2.**  
To incur a debt and issue bonds to the amount of \$15,000.00 to run not longer than fifteen years from date and to bear interest not exceeding five per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, for the purpose of constructing and furnishing a public school building at Mandeville, La., and purchase site, if necessary, for said school building, within said school district No. 4, title to which shall vest in the public.

For the purpose of said special election the polling place will be the usual polling place in the Fourth Ward of the parish of St. Tammany, La., and the following commissioners and clerk of election have been appointed to serve at this election: Dr. A. G. Maylie, Geo. Froesch and C. R. Poisson, commissioners, and H. A. Verrett, clerk.

At said special election the polls will open at 7 o'clock a. m. and close at 5 o'clock p. m., and the election will be conducted in accordance with the laws of Louisiana applicable thereto.

Notice is also given that at 10 o'clock a. m. on the 4th day of April, 1917, said parish school board of the parish of St. Tammany, La., will meet at Covington, La., and in open session proceed to open the ballot box, examine and count the ballots in number and amount, examine and canvass the returns and declare the result of said special election.

**ORDINANCES.**

**ORDINANCE NO. 58.**  
Ordinance regulating sanitation with reference to tuberculosis people or people with other disease containing infected sputum or other infectious secretions, and providing penalty for violation, etc.

Be it Ordained by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen and the Municipal Board of Health of the Town of Covington, La., as follows:

**Section 1.** That any person having tuberculosis who shall dispose of his sputum, saliva or other bodily secretion so as to cause offense or danger to any person or persons occupying the same room or apartment, house or part of a house or adjoining house or compartment, on complaint of any person or persons subjected to such offense or danger shall be deemed guilty of a nuisance, and any person subjected to such a nuisance may make complaint in person or writing to the Health Officer of the Town of Covington, setting forth the time, place and manner, in which such nuisances complained of has been committed, and it shall be the duty of said Health Officer to immediately investigate said complaint, and if it appears that the nuisance complained of is such as to cause offense or danger to any person occupying the same room, apartment, house or part of a house, he shall serve a notice on the person so complained of, reciting the alleged cause of offense or danger, and requiring him to dispose of his sputum, saliva or other bodily secretion or excretion, in such a manner as to remove all such reasonable cause of offense or danger.

**Section 2.** Any person who after having been warned in the manner set forth in section 1, shall upon a second offense be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction, be fined not more than \$25.00, or imprisoned more than thirty days, or both, at the discretion of the Court.

**Section 3.** Any person afflicted with tuberculosis of the lungs or larynx or any other disease whose virus or infecting agent is contained in the sputum, saliva or other infectious secretions, shall not deposit his sputum, saliva or other infectious secretions in such a public place as to cause offense or danger of contracting the disease to any other person or persons. It shall be the duty of every person afflicted with tuberculosis of the lungs or larynx or any other disease whose virus or infecting agent is contained in the sputum, saliva or other infectious secretions to provide himself with a sputum flask or receptacle in which to deposit his sputum, saliva or other infectious secretion while traveling in any public conveyance or attending any public place, and the contents of said flask or receptacle shall be burned or otherwise thoroughly disinfected.

Upon the complaint of any responsible person the Health Officer shall at once investigate the condition complained of, and if found dangerous or detrimental to the public health, the Health Officer shall report and enforce such orders as may be covered by anti-spitting ordinances at present in force.

This ordinance shall be posted in a conspicuous place in the rooms of all boarding houses or hotels, and restaurants, theatres, and other public places within the corporate limits of the town of Covington, provided that nothing in this Act shall be construed to in anywise abridge the rules or regulations provided for the establishment of hotels or boarding houses previously certified against tuberculosis occupants.

That this ordinance shall take effect from and after its promulgation.

**TRAINING CAMPS TO BE IN LA. TEXAS AND MEXICO.**

Training Camps in the Southern Department will be held in the States of Louisiana, Texas, and New Mexico, in the summer of 1917. While the exact locations of the camps have not been fully determined, the following is the program that probably will be put into effect:  
Austin, Texas—May 4, June 3.  
Dallas, Texas—June 16, July 15.  
Alexandria, La.—July 28, Aug. 27.  
Houston, Texas—Sept. 8, Oct. 7.  
Las Vegas, N. M.—July 21, August 20.

**Objects of the Camps.**  
The objects of the camps are to instruct and train the citizens of the country in the use of arms and in the tactical use of troops, to teach the military history and policy of the United States, and the military conditions existing therein, and also to prepare those desiring commissions in the Officers' Reserve Camp for the duties pertaining to such commissions.

**Qualifications for Attendance.**  
These camps may be attended by any male citizens of the United States, (or any male who has declared his intention of becoming a

citizen) between the ages of 18 and 45, who is in sound physical condition and of good moral character, and who has had the equivalent of a high school education.

Those who have the above qualifications, but who are between the ages of 45 and 55, may be authorized to attend, but entirely at their own expense.

**Obligations for Military Service.**  
Attendance at these camps involves absolutely no obligation of any kind for future military service. As explained below, those who have completed a course of three camps, may become members of the Officers' Reserve Corps, subject to call in the event of war.

**Transportation.**  
Transportation from the attendant's home to the camp and return, will be furnished by the United States; the exact manner in which this will be done has not yet been decided upon.

**Subsistence.**  
Subsistence while at the camp will be furnished by the United States without cost to the attendant.

**Uniform.**  
The uniform will be furnished at the expense of the United States in somewhat the following manner:

(a) The applicant is urged to furnish his own uniform. After be-

ing accepted as an attendant, he has the privilege of purchasing this uniform from the Government at the cost price, plus 10 per cent. At the conclusion of each of his three terms, he will then be reimbursed one-third of the amount so expended.

(b) The applicant may wear the uniform already purchased by him at some former camp, and he will be similarly reimbursed.

(c) Upon reporting at the camp and depositing \$10, a uniform will be furnished the attendant, to be returned by him at the conclusion of the camp. If no article of uniform has been lost or damaged other than by fair wear, the deposit will be returned, or in the event of loss or damage, a balance will be returned after the cost of the lost or damaged articles has been deducted.

**Arms, Equipment, Etc.**  
Attendants at the camp will be furnished coats, bedding, arms and equipment by the United States.

**Course of Instruction.**  
This includes a series of three camps, each of thirty days duration, and known respectively as the Red, White and Blue Camps. Instruction at the first camp will be a basic infantry course. For the second and third camps, the attendant will be allowed to choose the particular arm of the service in which he desires to be instructed, and will be taught the duties of officers and non-commissioned officers of that particular arm. In addition to the summer camps, a correspondence course will be conducted during the winter months for those desiring to continue their studies.

A part of the period of each camp will be devoted to march in which actual campaign conditions will be assumed, and in which problems of security, transportation, bivouac and combat will be solved.

**Officers' Reserve Corps.**  
Those who have completed the course of three camps and the prescribed winter work, will be given an opportunity to obtain a commission in the Officers' Reserve Corps, should they so desire.

**Typhoid Prophylaxis.**  
All students under forty-five years of age who have not had typhoid fever, or who are not otherwise protected against it, are urged to take the typhoid prophylaxis. This prophylaxis will be administered at the camp or to enrolled applicants prior to their arrival at the camps at such places as the department commander may designate, or a supply of the serum to be administered to enrolled applicants only may be sent to any reputable physician upon application.

**Applications.**  
Applications to attend any of the camps mentioned above should be made to the Officer in Charge of Training Camps, Southern Department, Fort Sam Houston, San Antonio, Texas.

**Future Announcements.**  
The information given above is tentative only, since some points in connection with the camps have not yet been decided. From time to time announcements will be made as the preparations for summer camps progress. Any information requested will be furnished by the officer in charge of these camps.
