CHARTERS AMENDMENT OF CHARTER of the COVINGTON GROCERY & GRAIN COMPANY, INC. State of Louisiana, Parish of St. Tammany. Be it known, that on this 29th day of September, 1917, before me, Lewis L. Morgan, a Notary Public in and for the Parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana, duly commissioned and qualified, and in the presence of the undersigned witnesses. Personal came and appeared E. J. Domergue and J. S. Waterman, respectively President and Secretary of the Covington Grocery & Grain Company, Inc., who declared that a meeting of the stockholders of said company was held at its office at Covington, Louisiana, on the 28th day of July, 1917, for the purpose of amending Articles I and IV of the Charter of this corporation, and that

notice of said meeting was given in accordance with the requirements of its charter and the laws of the State of Louisiana. And said appears further declared that at said meeting Articles I and IV of its Act of Incorporation were amended and re-enacted so as to read as follows: ARTICLE I. The name and style of this corporation shall be Covington Grocery & Grain Company, Inc., and its domicile is hereby established at Covington, St. Tammany Parish, Louisiana, and under its corporate name said corporation shall have power and authority to contract, sue and be sued; to make and use a corporate seal, and the same to break and alter at pleasure; to hold, receive, have, purchase, improve, alienate, convey, sell, borrow, pledge, mortgage and hypothecate under said corporate name, property, real, personal and mixed; to establish and operate branch offices and warehouses in this and other States of the United States; to name and appoint such managers, agents, directors and employees as its business, interests and convenience may require; and to make, establish, as well as amend from time to time such by-laws, rules and regulations for the proper government of the affairs of said corporation as may be deemed necessary and proper; and the same to change and alter at pleasure, and to do all other acts and things permitted by law, or that shall or may be necessary and proper to carry out the objects and purposes of said corporation. Said corporation, unless sooner dissolved, in accordance with its charter, shall have succession and enjoy existence for a period of ninety-nine years from date of its original act of incorporation, made by July 28, 1917. The President, or in his absence the Vice President, shall be the proper person upon whom attachment or other legal process shall be served. ARTICLE IV. The corporate powers of this company shall be vested in, and exercised by, a Board of seven Directors, consisting of the President (who may also be the Treasurer of said corporation), Vice President, Secretary and four stockholders, four of which Board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, and their decisions shall be valid, corporate acts. The following persons shall constitute the first Board of Directors: F. Salmen, Slidell, La. J. A. Bousquet, Slidell, La. Max Schwabacher, c-o N. O. Cor-bolaited Box Co., New Orleans, La. J. S. Waterman, 428 Gravier St., New Orleans, La. John T. Gibbons, Poydras and S. Peters St., New Orleans, La. C. W. Schmidt, c-o Guatemala Coffee Co., New Orleans, La. With E. J. Domergue as President and Treasurer, J. T. Gibbons as Vice President, and J. S. Waterman as Secretary. No person shall be elected as Director or as officer who is not a stockholder of this company. During the absence of the President, the Vice President shall act and preside. Said Board shall continue in office until the third Tuesday in January, 1918, on which date, and thereafter annually, a Board of Directors shall be elected, unless the same shall be a holdover, when the election shall be held on the next legal day thereafter. Notice of which election shall be given at least ten days continuous publication preceding each election in a newspaper published in the town of Covington; and the Board of Directors shall appoint one or more stockholders to preside at such election as commissioners. In the event of the failure of any commissioner or commissioners to attend, the President shall, by appointment, fill the vacancy. Any failure from any cause whatsoever, to elect Directors on the day named for that purpose shall

not dissolve the corporation, but the Directors then in office, as well as officers of said company, shall hold over until their successors are chosen. In which event the President shall cause another election to be held within thirty days, and shall give notice thereof as hereinabove provided. At each election and meeting, each stockholder shall be entitled to vote for each share of stock registered in his name, and may vote by proxy. The election of Directors shall be by ballot, and the majority in amount of votes cast, each share of stock voted upon to be counted for one vote, shall elect the person or persons for whom they have been cast.
