CHARTER OF THE DENDINGER MERCANTILE COMPANY, INCORPORATED.

United States of America, State of Louisiana, Parish of Orleans.

Be it known, that on this 17th day of the month of July, in the year 1918, before me, Jacob D. Dremer, a Notary Public, duly commissioned and qualified in and for the Parish of Orleans, State of Louisiana, and in the presence of the witnesses hereinafter named and undersigned, Personally came and appeared the several persons whose names are hereunto subscribed, who severally declared that they are all of lawful age and that availing themselves of the privileges of the statutes and laws of the State of Louisiana, relative to the formation of corporations, and particularly Act No. 267 of the session of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana, of 1914, they have covenanted and agreed, and do by these presents covenant and agree as well and bind and obligate themselves, as well as all such persons as may hereafter become associated with them, to form and constitute a body corporate and politic in law, for the objects and purposes, and under the stipulations and provisions following, to-wit:

ARTICLE I.

The name and title of this corporation shall be the Dendinger Mercantile Company, Incorporated, and under that name shall have and enjoy all the rights, privileges, and advantages granted by law to corporations, and shall have the power and authority to enjoy succession and corporate existence for and during the period of ninety-nine years from the date hereof, unless sooner dissolved in the manner hereinafter provided for.

ARTICLE II.

The objects and purposes for which this corporation is created are hereby declared to be the operating of a general merchandise store, buying, selling, and manufacturing any and all kinds of merchandise, food stuffs, and any and all things, articles, or materials that in any way make up, enter into, or are used for, the manufacture or construction of such articles or are used in connection with, or as accessory to such general merchandise business; and buying, selling, renting or leasing, managing, and in any way disposing of any mercantile or allied business or businesses and generally to do any and all things and acts whatsoever necessary, incidental to, connected with, or relating to the transaction of the said business of the said corporation.

ARTICLE III.

The capital stock of this corporation is hereby fixed at Twenty-four thousand (\$24,000.00) dollars, divided into or represented by two hundred and forty (240) shares of the par value of One Hundred (\$100) Dollars each, and when issued shall be paid for in cash or property or in the equivalent thereof. No certificate of stock shall be issued until the same shall have been paid for. The stock shall be evidenced by certificates issued and signed by the president and secretary. All shares of stock shall be issued as full paid and non-assessable and no transfer of stock shall be binding on said corporation, unless recorded on its books.

ARTICLE IV.

The domicile of this corporation shall be in the town of Mandeville, Parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana, and all citation or other legal process shall be served upon the president, and in his absence, as the law directs.

ARTICLE V.

All of the powers of this corporation shall be vested in, and the management and control of its affairs shall be exercised by a board of directors, to be composed of not less than five (5) stockholders, three (3) of whom shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of the business of the corporation, each of whom shall own in his own right, during the term of office, at least one full paid and unpledged share of the capital stock of this corporation.

ARTICLE VI.

The first board of directors of this corporation shall be composed of Theodore Dendinger, Sr., John Dendinger, George Dendinger, Theodore Dendinger, Jr., and James N. Cornet.

ARTICLE VII.

The said board of directors and the said officers above named shall serve and remain in office until the first Tuesday in July, 1919, on which day, and annually thereafter, the board of directors shall be elected by the

ARTICLE VIII.

stockholders at a meeting called for that purpose. All directors and officers shall hold office until their successors are elected and qualified and any failure to elect directors shall not be regarded as a forfeiture of this charter.

ARTICLE IX.

In the election of directors, each stockholder shall be entitled to one vote for each share of stock owned by him and standing in his name on the books of the company, and may be cast either in person or by letter, or by duly authorized proxy, and a majority of the votes cast shall elect, but no vote shall be allowed on any shares of stock transferred within thirty (30) days prior to said election. Any vacancy occurring in the board of directors shall be filled by the remaining directors for the unexpired term.

ARTICLE X.

All meetings of the stockholders shall be called by written notice, mailed to the last known address of each stockholder, not less than fifteen (15) days before the date fixed for such meeting, unless said notice has been waived in writing by the stockholder.

ARTICLE XI.

This act of incorporation may be amended, modified, changed, or altered, or this corporation may be dissolved with the assent of the stockholders holding and owning two-thirds of the capital stock thereof, who may be present or represented at a general meeting of the stockholders, convened for the purpose, and of which due notice has been given.

ARTICLE XII.

Whenever this corporation shall be dissolved, either by limitation or from other cause, its affairs shall be liquidated by two liquidators to be selected for that purpose from among the stockholders at a meeting of the stockholders convened for such purpose; said liquidators shall remain in office until the affairs of said corporation shall be fully and finally liquidated. Any vacancy occurring among the liquidators, from any cause whatsoever, shall be filled by the remaining liquidator. Said liquidators shall exercise all the rights conferred upon them by law and they are especially empowered to settle the affairs of said corporation, to collect the outstanding debts, sell and convey the property, pay its debts, and divide the remaining money and property among the stockholders.

ARTICLE XIII.

No stockholder shall ever be liable or responsible for the contracts of this corporation in any further sum than the unpaid balance due by him on his shares of stock subscribed to, or owned by him; nor shall any mere informality in the organization of this corporation have the effect of rendering this charter null, or of exposing any stockholder to any further liability than the unpaid amount which may be due on his stock subscription.

ARTICLE XIV.

The subscribers hereto have respectively written opposite their names the amount of stock subscribed for by them so that this act may also serve as the original subscription list of this corporation.

ARTICLE XV.

This done and passed, in duplicate, in my office at New Orleans, Louisiana, on the day, month and year herein first above written, in the presence of Misses Germaine De-

Lesseps and Edith V. Gemmill, competent witnesses, who have hereto signed with the said applicants, and me, Notary, after due reading of the whole.

ORDINANCES.

Whereas, in the opinion of this board it is necessary and advisable that a special election be ordered to be held in School District No. 10 of the parish of St. Tammany, La., at which there shall be submitted the following proposition, to-wit:

To incur debt and issue bonds to the amount of \$20,000 to run not longer than ten years from date and to bear interest not exceeding five per cent per annum payable semi-annually for the purpose of constructing and furnishing a public school building at Abita Springs, La., and purchase a site, if necessary, for the said school building within the said school district No. 10, title to which shall vest in the public.

Be it resolved by the St. Tammany, La., Parish School Board in legal session convened, as follows:

Section 1. That a special election be and the same is hereby ordered to be held in School District No. 10 in the parish of St. Tammany, La., on Tuesday, August 20, 1918, at which there shall be submitted the following proposition:

To incur debt and issue bonds to the amount of \$20,000 to run not longer than ten years from date and to bear interest not to exceed five per cent per annum payable semi-annually, for the purpose of constructing and furnishing a public school building at Abita Springs, La., and purchasing a site, if necessary, for the said school building, title to which shall vest in the public.

Section 2. That the secretary of this board be and he is hereby instructed to have prepared for use at said special election a sufficient number of ballots on each of which shall be printed the proposition printed in section one of this resolution, arranged in such manner as to enable the voters to vote on each separately and in the following form:

NOTE: NO VOTER to vote in favor of the proposition submitted upon this ballot, place a cross (X) in the square after the word "Yes"; to vote against it place a similar mark after the word "No."

And that the secretary of this board be and he is hereby instructed to have prepared for use at said special election all necessary ballot boxes, tally sheets, list of voters and compiled statement of voters in number and amount.

Section 3. That the polling place for said election shall be at the town hall of Abita Springs, La., and Jules Hardouin, A. O. Foss and A. B. Kustennmacher are hereby appointed commissioners, and G. H. Miller clerk of said election, to serve at said polling place on said election, and said election shall be conducted under the laws of the state applicable thereto.

Section 4. The president of the board is hereby instructed to give notice of the special election herein ordered by his proclamation to be published according to law, and in said proclamation he shall announce that at 10 o'clock a. m. on Friday, August 23, 1918, this board will meet at its usual meeting place in the town of Covington, La., and in open session proceed to open the ballot box, examine and count the ballots in number and amount, examine and canvass the returns and declare the result of the election.

On roll call the following members voted in the affirmative: O'Keefe, Levy, Kahl, Evans, Woodruff, Miller, Todd. The following voted in the negative: None.
