The criticism has often been heard, "Too many laws and too little observance of those we have," which really means, that it is useless to make laws if we do not enforce them.

The great trouble in the enforcement of laws is to get officers to report them and to get officials to impose the penalty in the courts when charges are made and proven.

Recent convictions for violations of the liquor laws in St. Tammany parish have been obtained by shrewd and persistent work of the Council of Defense.

In the trial of the two Abita cases, Wednesday, Judge Carter gave a most scathing rebuke to the defendants, especially in the Robinson case.

With all this, it would seem that officers should have made arrests, and not made it necessary for PRIVATE CITIZENS TO GET EVIDENCE UPON WHICH CONVICTIONS COULD BE MADE.

There is money in legitimate whisky selling to-day. One saloon in Covington that is not violating the law requires a satchel to carry money enough to cash checks on pay day, and sometimes cashes \$2000.00 worth of these checks in one night, which must represent a pretty good business.

There will be no interference with those who do a legitimate business, but the Council of Defense will see to it that violations of the law are punished. Those who believe they can escape the consequences of such violations will make a sad mistake.

PUT YOUR TRUST IN GOOD ROADS.

This is the last appeal that can be made to you, in this paper, to vote for the road proposition, as the election takes place on August 27.

Every voter has probably received a letter from the United States Shipping Board of the Emergency Fleet Corporation, which among other things states: "Your parish authorities having created a Road District out of the four wards which are to be immediately benefitted from the establishment of a Government shipbuilding plant at Madisonville, you are accordingly asked to vote what amounts to a three-mill tax to build and maintain \$150,000.00 worth of hard surfaced roads in this district."

Every property-holder knows what shipbuilding has done for him in filling his empty houses, in increasing his rent receipts, in enabling his tenants to make more money—in fact, in INCREASING BUSINESS OF EVERY DESCRIPTION and in MAKING TIMES PROSPEROUS.

You may be sure the Government will not keep the shipyards here if hard surfaced roads are not provided. On the 27th you will vote for or against shipbuilding just as effectively as if the proposition were put to you in that form.
