AN ORDINANCE. An ordinance fixing the budget for the year 1919.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the police jury of the parish of St. Tammany, Louisiana, that the taxes for the year 1918 be and the same are hereby levied on all taxable property in the parish of St. Tammany, as follows, to-wit:

For the Criminal Fund there shall be levied the sum of one mill. For the Road Fund there shall be levied the sum of two mills, of which one-half mill, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be held in trust to provide the payment of the bonds on the Madisonville road and the Keller certificates of indebtedness now held by the Covington Bank & Trust Company.

For the General Fund there shall be levied the sum of two and one-half mills of which the sum of one mill, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be held in trust to provide the payment of the dipping vat bonds and interest to come due July 1, 1919.

shall be levied the sum of four and one-half mills.

For the Special Parish Road Tax Bonds there shall be levied the sum of one mill.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, that the above taxes shall be levied on the basis of 60 per cent of the assessed value of the parish.

Section 3. Be it further ordained, that all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.
