



AN ORDINANCE.

The following ordinance was read and adopted:

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of St. Tammany Parish, La., that the political sub-division of this parish created by ordinance dated June 18, 1919, and known as Road District No. 1 of St. Tammany Parish, be, and the same is hereby repealed.

Be it further ordained, That the bond issue voted in said Road District on the 27th of August, 1918, for the sum of \$150,000 for roads in said District, be, and the same is hereby repealed, annulled and avoided.

the said three and one-half mills tax for Wards Nos. One, Three, Four and Ten shall be reduced to such an amount as shall be necessary to meet the difference between the amount heretofore collected and the pro rata of said Wards, which may be due under the \$750,000 Road Bond Issue.

AN ORDINANCE.

On motion of J. M. Smith, seconded by Theo. Dendinger, Jr., the following ordinance was introduced and unanimously carried:

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of St. Tammany Parish, La., that an ordinance dated the 29th of April, 1918, to provide for the issuance of \$27,000 public improvement bonds under and by virtue of Act 96 of 1916 for the purpose of building a road between Madisonville and Covington and Covington and the Tangipahoa line, be, and the same is hereby repealed.

Be it further ordained, That no further taxes be placed to the credit of the sinking fund known as the Madisonville Road Fund, under and by virtue of said ordinance.

Be it further enacted, That this ordinance shall take effect from and after date of its passage. Adopted Sept. 9, 1919. J. B. HOWZE, President. F. J. MARTINDALE, Secretary.

AN ORDINANCE.

The following ordinance was read and adopted:

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of St. Tammany Parish, That ordinance dated April 17, 1919, levying a tax of six (6) mills on the assessable property of St. Tammany Parish, for the purpose of meeting the semi-annual interest due December 31st, 1919, and the principal and interest due June 1, 1920, for the Good Road Bond Issue of \$750,000 voted April 15, 1919, be and the same is hereby amended; and the said tax of six (6) mills is hereby reduced to the sum of three and one-half mills, being a sum sufficient for the present year to cover principal and interest due in 1919 and 1920 on the said bonds.

Be it further ordained, That the Assessor of the Parish of St. Tammany be and he is hereby instructed to levy said tax in accordance herewith. Adopted Sept. 9, 1919. J. B. HOWZE, President. F. J. MARTINDALE, Secretary.

AN ORDINANCE.

The following ordinance was offered by J. M. Smith and duly seconded by E. J. Domergue, which was unanimously adopted:

Whereas, under the contract of the Hibernia Bank & Trust Company, of New Orleans, Louisiana, for the purchase of the \$750,000.00 St. Tammany Parish, Louisiana, Road Bonds, issued under an authority of the election held in said parish on the 15th day of April, 1919, said bank is entitled to become the Fiscal Agent of the Parish of St. Tammany for the deposit of the funds realized from the sale of these bonds, and

Whereas, under and by virtue of the authority given by Section 8 of Act 205 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana for the year 1912, and by Section 6 of Act 30 of the General Assembly of Louisiana, the Extra Session held in the year 1917, the Police Jury is authorized to designate said Hibernia Bank & Trust Company as such Fiscal Agent for the deposit of the proceeds of the bonds and the proceeds of the taxes as collected from time to time for the sinking fund required to pay such bonds and interest thereon, therefore be it

Ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of St. Tammany, in regular session assembled, that the Hibernia Bank & Trust Company, of New Orleans, Louisiana, is hereby appointed and designated the Fiscal Agent of the Parish of St. Tammany for the receipt and deposit of the proceeds of the sale of said bonds and the taxes collected to provide a sinking fund for the payment of principal and interest on said bonds, said funds to be on deposit subject to the terms of the bid of the Hibernia Bank & Trust Company for this bond issue, which was accepted by this Police Jury, and upon said Hibernia Bank & Trust Company furnishing acceptable security in the sum of \$200,000 in the manner provided by said Act 205 of 1912.

A RESOLUTION.

On motion of Mr. Smith, seconded by Mr. Fenderson, the following resolution was introduced, voted and unanimously carried:

Resolved, That the minutes of the Police Jury's meeting of the 11th day of March, 1919, do not include all of the roads proposed to be built by the resolution of that date and that subsequent resolution promulgated in The Farmer with respect to other roads not included, therefore

Be it resolved, That the minutes of said meeting be and the same are hereby corrected so as to read as follows:

Whereas, it is contemplated to submit the question of a \$750,000 road bond issue to the vote of the people for the purpose of hard surfacing existing roads and highways in the Parish of St. Tammany, La., and

Whereas, there are still certain roads which have not heretofore been built on account of the lack of provision of funds, now, therefore

Be it resolved That the following road building program be adopted for the year 1919-1920 for which roads are to be constructed in addition to those which are now at present in use:

- St. Tammany-Lacombe road. Middle Road. Completion of Turnpike road. Completion of Military Road. Completion of McDougall Road. Completion of Lee Road. Bennett Bridge Road. Road from Folsom to Bush. Ben Williams Road. Lacombe to Lake. Covington to Hammand-Tangipahoa Line Road. St. Tammany-Abita Road. Hardsurfacing Pearl River road to Slidell. Hardsurfacing road to Slidell via Mandeville. Hardsurfacing Columbia Road. Hardsurfacing Tallisheek to Columbia road. Hardsurfacing Holmesville Road via Folsom to Parish Line. Hardsurfacing-Madisonville-Ponchatoula Road. Hardsurfacing Hammond-Covington Road. Hardsurfacing Hammond-Covington-Slidell Road. Hardsurfacing Chin-huba to Houltonville Road. Hardsurfacing Mandeville-Lewisburg Road.
