

CHARTER OF THE FREDERICK-BLANCHARD LUMBER CO., INC.

United States of America, State of Louisiana, Parish of St. Tammany.

Be it known and remembered, that on this 13th day of October, A. D. 1919, before me, Lewis Lovrinus Morgan, a notary public duly commissioned and qualified in and for the parish and state aforesaid, personally came and appeared the persons whose names are hereunto subscribed, all of full age, who declare unto me, notary, in the presence of the undersigned competent witnesses, that, availing themselves of the provisions of the laws of the State of Louisiana relative to corporations, they have covenanted and agreed, and do by these presents covenant and agree, and bind themselves, as well as such other persons as may hereafter become associated with them, to form and constitute a body politic in law for the purposes and objects and under the stipulations and conditions hereinafter set forth, to-wit:

ARTICLE I. The name and title of this corporation shall be "Frederick-Blanchard Lumber Co., Incorporated."

and its domicile is hereby established at Madisonville, in the parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana. Unde rits said corporate name this corporation shall have power and authority to contract, sue and be sued; to make and use a corporate seal, and the same to break and alter at pleasure; to hold, receive, have purchase, improve, alienate, convey, sell, borrow, pledge, mortgage and hypothecate, in its said corporate name, property, real, personal and mixed; to name and appoint such officers, directors, agents, managers, foremen and such other employees as the interests or conveniences of this corporation may require; to make and establish by-laws, rules and regulations for the proper management and regulation of its affairs as may be deemed necessary and proper, and the same to change or alter at pleasure; and to do all other acts and things permitted by law as may be necessary to carry on the objects and purposes of this corporation, as herein set out.

Said corporation, unless sooner dissolved in accordance with the stipulations of this charter, shall exist and continue to have succession for a period of ninety-nine (99) years from date hereof. The president, or, in his absence, the vice-president, or, in his absence,

the secretary, shall be the proper person upon whom citation or other legal process shall be served.

ARTICLE II.

The objects and purposes for which this corporation is organized, and the nature of the business to be carried on by it, are declared to be the following, to-wit:

To construct, operate and maintain saw mills, planing mills; to construct a general saw mill business, including piling and all other kinds of wood products, including arpening and retort plants; to operate a commissary and store business in connection therewith and generally to do and perform any and all acts and things pertaining to the business above enumerated or connected therewith, or arising therefrom in this state and elsewhere; to purchase and sell lands and timber, and to engage in any enterprise in any wise connected with or relating to the land and timber business; to sell and export timber, lumber and all forest products; to build, repair and dock vessels; to acquire, own and operate, and to charter or lease, and to sell vessels of every description; to construct, own, operate, build and lease railroads and tram roads; to construct, own and operate docks, wharves and warehouses; to buy, have, own, and sell steel, iron and ore; to hold, receive, hire, purchase, lease, sub-lease, sell, convey or exchange property, both real and personal, and to mortgage and hypothecate the same; to borrow or lend money; to appoint managers, officers, agents and employees in the State of Louisiana and other States, as its interests may require; to do and perform all other things requisite, necessary or convenient to enable it to carry out the objects and purposes above set forth.

ARTICLE III.

The capital stock of this corporation shall be the sum of twenty-five thousand (\$25,000) dollars, divided into and represented by two hundred and fifty (250) shares of the par value of one hundred (\$100) dollars each, which stock shall be paid for in cash, or the same may be issued and delivered in payment for actual services rendered the company, or in exchange for property or rights transferred to or received by said company; but no stock shall ever be issued or delivered except at its par value for cash, or for services actually rendered, or property actually transferred.

The capital stock of this company may be increased or decreased by complying with the laws of the State of Louisiana providing for the increase or decrease of the stock of corporations.

Any stockholder may sell, assign or transfer his stock in this corporation provided thirty (30) days prior notice of such intention to sell assign or transfer the same be given the company. The company shall have first privilege of purchasing same, after which notice the said stock may be sold in open market.

The capital stock of this company shall be non-assessable, and transferable only on the books of the company, subject, however, to the laws relative to the delivery of stock certificates.


This corporation shall be authorized to commence doing business as soon as fifteen thousand (\$15,000) dollars of the capital stock shall have been subscribed for. The board of directors shall have the right to determine how much stock shall be issued.

ARTICLE IV.

The corporate powers of this company shall be vested in and exercised by a board of directors, which shall be composed of three stockholders of this company. Said board of directors shall be elected annually by the stockholders on the first Tuesday of November in each and every year, which annual meeting of the stockholders shall be held at the office of the company in Madisonville, La., of which meeting notice shall be given by at least fifteen (15) days previous publication immediately preceding such election in the official journal for the Parish of St. Tammany, La., or by at least ten (10) days written notice to each stockholder. The first election hereunder shall be held on the first Tuesday of November, 1919, until which time the following persons shall be and constitute the board of directors of this company, to-wit: E. J. Frederick, P. A. Blanchard and M. P. Planche. Any vacancy occurring in the board of directors during its term of office shall be filled by election by the remaining members of the board. Two (2) members of the board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business and their decisions shall be valid corporate acts. At each annual meeting of the board of directors held on the first Tuesday of November, 1919, and annually thereafter, the said board shall elect from among its members a president, a vice-president, a secretary and treasurer, and such other officers as may be necessary, and the said officers shall hold office for one year, or until their successors are elected. Until the first election the following are declared to be the officers of this corporation, to-wit: E. J. Frederick, president; M. P. Planche, vice-president, and P. A. Blanchard, secretary-treasurer.

During the absence of the president the vice-president shall act and preside. At every election and meeting each stockholder shall be entitled to one vote for each share of stock registered in his name, and may vote by proxy. The election of directors shall be by ballot, and a majority in amount of votes cast, each share of stock voted upon to be counted for one vote, shall elect the person or persons for whom they have been cast.

ARTICLE V. It shall be lawful for the stockholders of this corporation, at a general meeting convened for that purpose, to make any modifications, additions or changes in this act of incorporation, or to dissolve it with the assent of three-fourths of the stock represented at such meetings. Notice of such meeting shall be given as prescribed in Article IV hereof for the election of directors.

ARTICLE VI. No stockholder of this corporation shall ever be held liable or responsible for the contracts or faults hereof in any further sum than the unpaid balance due the company on the shares of stock subscribed for or owned by him, nor shall any informality in organization have the effect of rendering this charter null, or of exposing a stockholder to any liability beyond the unpaid balance, if any, of his stock.


ARTICLE VII. In case of dissolution or termination of this corporation, whether by limitation of its charter or from any other cause, the liquidation of its affairs shall be conducted by three (3) liquidators selected from the stockholders of the company by a majority of the votes cast at a meeting called for that purpose after notice shall have been given, as provided in Article IV hereof for the election of directors. Said liquidators shall remain in office until the affairs of the said corporation have been fully liquidated. In case of the death of one or more of said liquidators, the survivor or survivors shall continue to act.
