**CHARTER OF THE RIVERSIDE LUMBER COMPANY, INCORPORATED.**

United States of America, State of Louisiana, Parish of St. Tammany.

Be it known, That on this fourteenth (14th) day of the month of January, in the year of our Lord, One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty, before me, Arthur L. Bear, a Notary Public in and for the Parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana, duly commissioned and qualified and therein residing, and in the presence of the witnesses hereinafter named and undersigned, personally came and appeared the several persons whose names are hereunto subscribed, who severally declared that availing themselves of the provisions of the laws of the State of Louisiana, relative to corporations and their organization, and especially of Act 267 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana, for the year 1914, they have covenanted and agreed, and by these presents do covenant and agree, and bind themselves as well as such other persons as may hereafter become associated with them, or their successors, to form and constitute a body politic in law, for the purposes and objects, and under the stipulations and agreements, hereinafter set forth, which they hereby adopt as their Charter, to-wit:

**ARTICLE I.**  
The name and title of this corporation is hereby declared to be "Riverside Lumber Company, Incorporated," and its domicile shall be in the Town of Madisonville, in the Parish of St. Tammany, in the State of Louisiana, and by this name it shall have full and lawful existence and succession for a period of ninety-nine (99) years from and after the date hereof, unless sooner dissolved by law or by the consent of the stockholders as hereinafter provided.

Under this name this corporation shall have the power and authority to contract; to sue and be sued; to make and use a corporate seal with such inscription and device as may be selected therefor by the Board of Directors, and the same to break or alter at pleasure; to hold, lease, receive, purchase, sell, convey, alienate, borrow, pledge, mortgage and hypothecate, under its corporate name, property, real, personal and mixed, movable and immovable; to issue bonds as the law permits; to name and appoint such officers, directors, managers, agents and employees as the interest and convenience of said corporation may require; to make and use such by-laws and rules and regulations for the proper management of its affairs as may be deemed necessary and proper; and the same to reasonably change, at pleasure; and to do all other acts and things permitted by law, or such as may be necessary for the proper conduct of its affairs, or to carry into effect any of the powers, privileges and immunities it is permitted to hold and exercise under the laws of the State of Louisiana.

**ARTICLE II.**  
All citations, or other legal processes shall be served on the president, or in his absence, on the secretary, or in his absence, on the secretary-treasurer of this corporation, at its domicile, in accordance with the statutes of the State of Louisiana, relative to making service on corporations.

**ARTICLE III.**  
The objects and purposes for which this corporation is organized and established, and the nature of the business to be carried on by it, are declared to be: To engage in and carry on the business of acquiring, owning, buying, selling, leasing, mortgaging, exchanging, manufacturing, distributing, marketing or otherwise dealing in lumber and the various products and by-products thereof, and to carry on in any capacity any business pertaining to or which in the judgment of the company may at any time be conveniently and lawfully conducted in conjunction with any of the matters aforesaid, and to own such real estate as may be necessary or proper in connection therewith.

**ARTICLE IV.**  
The capital stock of this organization is hereby fixed at Fifteen Thousand (\$15,000) Dollars, divided into and represented by one hundred and fifty (150) shares of stock, of the par value of One Hundred (\$100) Dollars each, which shall be paid for in cash, or the same may be issued and delivered in payment for actual services rendered the corporation, or in exchange for property or rights transferred to or received by said corporation; but no stock shall ever be issued or delivered except at its par value for cash, or for services actually rendered, or property actually transferred.

All of said stock shall be Common Stock.

The capital stock of this corporation may be increased or decreased by complying with the laws of the State of Louisiana providing for the increase or decrease of the stock of corporations.

Any stockholder may sell, assign or transfer his stock in this corporation provided thirty (30) days prior notice of such intention to sell, assign or transfer the same be given the corporation through its Board of Directors. The corporation, through its Board of Directors, shall have its first privilege of purchasing same, after which notice the said stock may be sold in open market.

The capital stock of this corporation shall be non-assessable, and transferrable only on the books of the corporation, subject, however, to the laws relative to the delivery of stock certificates.

This corporation shall be authorized to commence doing business as soon as Ten Thousand (\$10,000) Dollars of the capital stock shall have been subscribed for.

**ARTICLE V.**

All the corporate powers of this corporation and the management and control of its affairs shall be vested in and exercised by a Board of Directors of five (5) stockholders, to be known as Directors. There shall be no quorum of the Board of Directors authorized to do business unless a majority of the members be present in person or by proxy, and in addition represent the majority of the shares of stock individually or by proxy. Any Director shall have the right to appoint, by written instrument, another Director as his or her proxy to act in his or her stead, at any and all meetings of the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors shall have the power and authority to make such by-laws, rules and regulations as may be necessary for the proper management of the affairs of this corporation and to amend and change the same as they may deem proper, provided the same shall not conflict with the provisions of this charter, nor with the laws of the State of Louisiana, nor with the laws of these United States of America, and shall have the power and authority to provide for and contract debts, borrow money, issue bonds, drafts, notes, acceptances and other evidences of indebtedness and to execute and accept, pledges, mortgages, deeds and other acts. It shall have the right to appoint and dismiss the officers and employees of the corporation, as the interest and business of the same may require and to fix the amount of their compensation and the time and manner of the payment thereof. And they shall have the right, power and authority to fill any vacancy arising in their number and to do all other things incident to the objects and purposes of the corporation and to vest the president or other officer or officers with such of these powers as they see fit.

**ARTICLE VI.**  
The first election of the Board of Directors under this charter shall be held on the first Tuesday in November, 1920, at the office of the corporation at Madisonville, parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana, and thereafter the stockholders shall hold a meeting annually on the first Tuesday in November of each year at the office of said corporation, to elect any business coming before them, and elect a Board of Directors. Notice of stockholders' meeting shall be given in writing, by mail, addressed to each stockholder at his usual place of business, fifteen (15) days prior to the date of such meeting. The election of the Board of Directors shall be by ballot, under such rules and regulations as may be determined by the Board of Directors, and each stockholder shall be entitled to one (1) vote, either in person or by proxy, for each share owned by him, and a majority of the votes shall elect such person or persons for whom they are cast. The Directors thus elected shall continue in office for one (1) year, or until their successors shall have been duly elected and qualified. No failure to elect shall be regarded as a forfeiture of this charter. The Board of Directors shall at its first meeting after its election, out of its own number, elect a President, Vice-President and Secretary-Treasurer. These officers shall hold office until their successors are duly elected and qualified. Said Board of Directors, or its successors, may, if they desire, sub-divide the office of Secretary-Treasurer into two (2) offices, that of Secretary and of Treasurer.

**ARTICLE VII.**  
Until the election to be held on the first Tuesday of November, 1920, the following named persons, stockholders of this corporation, shall constitute the first Board of Directors of this corporation, to-wit:

Mr. Harry Hayden, postoffice Madisonville, Louisiana; and Mr. Paul A. Blanchard, postoffice Madisonville, Louisiana; Mr. Thomas H. Hayden, postoffice Madisonville, Louisiana; Mr. Samuel J. Blanchard, postoffice New Orleans, Louisiana; Mr. Geo. A. Mire, postoffice Madisonville, Louisiana.

With the said Mr. Harry O. Hayden, as President; and Mr. Thomas H. Hayden, as Vice-President; and Mr. Paul A. Blanchard, as Secretary-Treasurer.

**ARTICLE VIII.**  
This Act of Incorporation may be changed, modified or altered, or this corporation may be dissolved, or liquidated, or may be reorganized, or may be amended by Sections 28, 29 and 30 of Act 267 of the Acts of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana for the year 1914, and other existing laws.

**ARTICLE IX.**  
No stockholder of this corporation shall ever be liable for or responsible for the contracts, debts, or failure of this corporation, in any further sum than the unpaid balance due said corporation on shares subscribed for and owned by the said stockholder; nor shall any informality in the organization of this corporation have effect of rendering this charter null or of exposing a stockholder to any further liability beyond the unpaid balance due on the shares of stock owned by him.

Thus done and passed at my office in the Town of Covington, Parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana, on the day, month and year first above written, in the presence of Miss Gable Boudousquie and Miss Ira M. Chaze, competent witnesses, residing in the Parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana, who signed these presents together with said applicants, and me, Notary, after due reading of the whole.

**AN ORDINANCE** regulating the production and distribution of dairy products.  
Section 1—It is hereby declared to be unlawful for any person or corporation to maintain or operate a dairy, or to sell or otherwise dispose of dairy products within the town of Covington without a permit from this Board and compliance with the provisions of this ordinance.  
Section 2—Applicants shall state in writing the name and address of the applicant; the dairy from which is produced, or from which is procured dairy products; the number of cows; the average quantity of products produced or procured; the av-

plant only. Consumers may receive milk in their own receptacles only at the dairy plant. In quantities over 5 gallons, storage and delivery must be effected in cans or receptacles sealed by wire, or chain and lock.  
No container shall be delivered or taken from any disease infected premises, and distributors shall not enter such buildings, but shall make delivery in the yard or on the sidewalk in containers furnished by the occupants thereof.  
Section 8—Pure water of adequate supply must be provided for maintaining the health of the cows, and for the sanitation of the dairy utensils, and no unhealthy or fermented food or substance shall be fed.  
Section 9—No room shall be used for stabling cows, or for storing dairy products which contains any source of noxious gases or infective organisms, nor shall any source of contamination be permitted within 25 feet thereof.  
Provided, that flush water closets having a fine extending above the building shall be permitted.  
Section 10—Dairy enclosures must be graded and drained, and no garbage, fecal matter or similar substance shall be placed or permitted to remain in or on such enclosures.  
Section 11—The sale or use of dairy products from cows afflicted with tuberculosis, splenic fever, anthrax or other disease is prohibited; and it shall be lawful for this board to cause cows to be tested, and, if found to be diseased, to order their isolation and treatment, or slaughter, at the expense of the owner or owners.  
Section 12—Dairy attendants shall maintain strict cleanliness, and no person suffering from, or who has within a period specified by the health officer been exposed to contagious, infectious skin or venereal diseases shall work in or about any dairy.  
Section 13—It shall be unlawful for any pedestrian, or for any vehicle upon or from which dairy products, are, or are being distributed, to carry any unwholesome matter, or any water or material with which cream or milk might be adulterated.  
Section 14—The health authority shall have the right to at all times stop pedestrians and vehicle distributors of dairy products, and to enter the dairy or premises of any distributor for the purpose of examining the products and utensils and appliances thereon or therein; and distributors shall, on demand, allow inspection or entry, and furnish for examination samples of their products, not to exceed one pint.  
Section 15—It shall be unlawful for any distributor to have with him to sell or deliver milk from which the cream or part of the cream has been removed, unless a sign bearing in conspicuous letters the legend "Skimmed Milk," and the name of the distributor is attached to every container.  
Section 16—Any unsanitary method or condition applying to dairies and dairy products, or fraudulent distribution of such products, not specifically regulated by this ordinance, is declared to be unlawful, if in the opinion of the sanitary inspector it is deemed a sanitary menace or fraud.  
Section 17—"Dairy products" is here defined as milk, cream, cheese, buttermilk, and all products having milk as a base. "Distributors" is defined as producers, vendors and donors.  
Section 18—Any person who shall violate any provision of this ordinance shall be liable to a fine of not less than \$10, nor more than \$25, or imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or both, at the discretion of any court of jurisdiction.  
Section 19—This ordinance shall become effective from and after the date of its promulgation.
