

Covington, La., March 9th, 1920. To the Honorable President and Members of the Police Jury: Gentlemen: We the undersigned committee were appointed at a recent meeting of the Bar Association of the Twenty-Sixth Judicial District for St. Tammany Parish, for the purpose of calling to the attention of your Honorable Body, the unsanitary conditions of the courthouse, the deplorable condition in which the records are being kept, and the inadequacy of the facilities for handling these records. Your Honorable Body will realize that these conditions should be immediately corrected. The sanitary conditions for reasons of health and the records for the reason that the titles to all the property belonging to the citizens of St. Tammany is predicated and dependent upon the safety and preservation of the official records of this parish. There has been considerable discussion as to the necessity of building a new court house but we believe this to be impracticable at the present time due to the scarcity of labor, the high cost of material and the lack of sufficient funds, and we believe that with the expenditure of a reasonable amount of money, the present court house can be put in con-

dition to meet all the requirements of the citizens of this Parish for a number of years to come. As these matters are of vital importance to the citizens and taxpayers of this parish and as the attorneys of this bar are naturally more familiar with these conditions than the average citizen, as much of their time is spent in and around the Court House, where the records are kept, and the unsanitary conditions prevail, we have deemed it our sacred duty to have a committee appointed by this Bar to call these matters to the attention of your Honorable Body, with the request that you appoint a committee to investigate conditions in the court house and the records, and to invest this committee to take such action in the premises as they deem it advisable and necessary to alleviate the present disgraceful conditions and to modernize the Court House and bring the records down to date in proper form.
