


ers qualified under the laws of the constitution of the State of Louisiana to vote at said election the following proposition, to-wit:

To levy a special tax of three mills on the dollar on all of the property in School District No. 2 of the Parish of St. Tammany, La., subject to taxation, annually, for a period of ten years, for the purpose of giving additional aid to the public schools of said District No. 2.

For the purpose of the said election the polling places will be as follows: First Precinct, Sandy Ford, the usual polling place provided by law; Second Precinct, Folsom, the usual polling place provided by law; and the following commissioners and clerks of election have been appointed to serve at this election: First Precinct, Sandy Ford, John H. Sharp, Ofie Sharp and N. G. Fuesell, commissioners, and W. M. Galloway, clerk. Second Precinct, Folsom, H. N. Fenderson, Norman Coer and D. M. Bryant, commissioners, and J. E. Blackwell, clerk.

At said election the polls will open at seven o'clock a. m., and close at five o'clock p. m., and the election will be conducted in accordance with the laws of Louisiana applicable thereto.

Notice is also given that at ten o'clock a. m., on the 20th day of August, 1920, the said St. Tammany Parish School Board will meet at the courthouse in Covington, La., and in open session proceed to open the ballot boxes, examine and count the ballots in number and amount, examine and canvass the returns, and declare the results of the said special election. This 9th day of July, 1920.


