AN ORDINANCE establishing Road District Number Two (2) for the Parish of St. Tammany.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of St. Tammany, Louisiana, that it does hereby create what shall be hereafter known and designated as Road District No. 2 for the Parish of St. Tammany; said Road District No. 2 shall consist of and embrace and include Wards Eight and Nine of the Parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana, in their entirety.

Section 2. Be it further ordained etc., That Covington, Louisiana, the county seat of the Parish of St. Tammany, is hereby designated as the domicile of said Road District No. 2 of the Parish of St. Tammany, Louisiana.

Section 3. Be it further ordained, etc., That inasmuch as more than fifty per cent of the property owners of the Parish of St. Tammany, which wards constitute and compose said Road District No. 2, have requested this body to create said Road District, and to appoint and name a Supervising Board in accordance with the provisions of Act 30 of 1917 of the General Assembly, it is hereby ordered that the following named persons shall compose the Supervising Board of said Road District No. 2: Dr. John K. Griffith, chairman; F. Salmen, J. D. Grant, Don F. Watts and W. A. Spiers.

Section 4. Be it further ordained, etc., That the said Supervising Board above appointed and named shall have the right to exercise all of the power and authority vested in it by the laws of the State of Louisiana, and especially Act 30 of 1917.

Section 5. Be it further ordained, etc., That this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its promulgation.







GETTING THE SHORTHORN INTO AFRICA



The American thoroughbred stock-breeder, who thinks he encounters trials and adverse conditions, is invited to take a look of this picture. It shows the difficulties of the South African breeder in trying to introduce the shorthorn into Northern Rhodesia, and a plan recently adopted in getting shorthorn bulls from the Union of South Africa, through the Tsetse-fly country. The animals are enveloped in a specially constructed khaki mackintosh, leaving only the eyes, horn and nose exposed. The exposed parts are covered with wagon grease and the herd marches only by night when the fly is less on-the-wing. The native cows are then bred to the shorthorn.
