Section One. Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Town of Covington, La., in legal session convened, that from and after the passage of this ordinance, it shall be unlawful, and it is hereby expressly prohibited for any person, corporation, firm or individual to place, or permit to remain upon any sidewalk or banquette in said Town of Covington, any goods, wares, merchandise, vegetables, fruits, crates, boxes or any other obstruction, total or partial, for the purpose of display or sale, or any other purpose.

AMENDMENT TO CHARTER of the ST. TAMMANY CONSTRUCTION COMPANY, INC.
United States of America, State of Louisiana, Parish of St. Tammany.
Be it known, that on this seventh day of the month of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, and of the independence of the United States of America the one hundred and forty-fifth, before me, Lewis L. Morgan, a Notary Public, duly commissioned and sworn in and for the Parish of St. Tammany, therein residing, and in the presence of the witnesses hereinafter named and undersigned, personally came and appeared R. S. Daniel and Fernando Estopinal, both residents of the Parish of St. Tammany, who declare that a general meeting of the stockholders of the St. Tammany Construction Company, Incorporated, was held at its office in the Town of Covington, Louisiana, on the 5th day of March, 1921, for the purpose of amending Article One of its charter, of which meeting due and legal notice was given in accordance with the requirements of its charter and the laws of the State of Louisiana.

AN ORDINANCE granting a ferry franchise.
Whereas, due notice has been given according to law for the sale of a franchise for the operation of a ferry for carrying freight and passengers for hire across the Tchoufouctia River within a radius of two miles of the point where the Houltonville Ferry is now being operated by Ernest Guitteau; and,
Whereas, Ernest Guitteau was the only bidder appearing for the purpose of obtaining said franchise; and,
Whereas, no other bids have been received; now, therefore,
Be it ordained, That the Parish of St. Tammany does hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Ernest Guitteau, a resident of St. Tammany parish, a franchise for a period of ten years under which he shall operate a ferry for carrying freight and passengers for hire across the Tchoufouctia River within a radius of two miles of the point where the Houltonville Ferry is now being operated by Ernest Guitteau.

And applicants further declare that at said stockholders' meeting of the St. Tammany Construction Company Incorporated, Article One of its charter of incorporation was amended and reenacted so as to read as follows:
ARTICLE ONE.
"The name and title of the corporation shall be St. Tammany Construction Company, Incorporated, and its domicile is hereby established at Madisonville, State of Louisiana; and, under its said corporate name, said corporation shall have power and authority to sue and be sued; to make and use a corporate seal, and the same to break and alter at pleasure; to hold, receive, have purchase, improve, alienate, convey, sell, borrow, pledge, mortgage and hypothecate, under its said name, property, real, personal and mixed; to name and appoint such officers, directors, agents and managers or employees as the interest or convenience of said corporation may require;

Be it further ordained, That it shall be unlawful for any other person to operate a ferry within a radius of two miles of the point where the above described ferry is now being operated.
Be it further ordained, That the rate of ferrage and toll to be charged thereon shall be as follows:
Children going to school, free.
Between the hours of 6 in the morning and 6 in the evening, pedestrians, 10c each way.
Single wagons and buggies, 50c.
Double teams, 75c.
Ford autos and runabouts, 50c.
Oxen, mules and horses, one 20c, two or more 15c each.
Trucks, one ton, 75c.
Trucks of two tons and up, \$1.00.
Persons who occupy horses and buggies, free.
