



SCHOOL BOARD.
The following resolution was introduced by Mr. Baneks, who moved its adoption, seconded by Mr. Keller:
Whereas, in the opinion of this Board it is necessary and advisable that a special election should be ordered to be held in School District No. 3 of the Parish of St. Tammany, Louisiana, at which there shall be submitted the following proposition, to-wit:
To levy a special tax of two and one-half (2 1/2) mills on the dollar on all property in School District No. 3 of the Parish of St. Tammany, Louisiana, subject to taxation annually for a period of ten (10) years for the purpose of giving additional aid to the public schools of said District No. 3, therefore
Be it resolved by the St. Tammany, Louisiana, Parish School Board in legal session convened, as follows:
Section 1. That a special election be and the same is ordered to be held in School District No. 3 in the Parish of St. Tammany, Louisiana, on Tuesday, August 16, 1921, at which there shall be submitted the following proposition:
To levy a special tax of two and one-half (2 1/2) mills on the dollar on all property in School District No. 3 of the Parish of St. Tammany, Louisiana, subject to taxation annually for a period of ten (10) years for the purpose of giving additional aid to the public schools of said District No. 3.
Section 2. That the Secretary of this Board be and he is hereby instructed to have prepared for use at said special election a sufficient number of ballots on each of which shall be printed the proposition mentioned in Section 1 of this resolution in the following form:
Proposition.
To levy a special tax of two and one-half (2 1/2) mills on the dollar on all property in School District No. 3 of the Parish of St. Tammany, La., subject to taxation, annually, for a period of ten (10) years, for the purpose of giving additional aid to the public schools of said Dist. No. 3.
Signature of Voter.
Taxable valuation.....
Notice To Voters—To vote in favor of the proposition submitted upon this ballot, place a cross (X) mark in the square after the word "YES"; to vote against it, place a similar mark after the word "NO."
And that the secretary of this board be and he is hereby instructed to have prepared for use at such election, all necessary ballot boxes, tally sheets, list of voters, and completed statement of voters in number and amount.
Section 3. That the polling place of said election shall be at the St. Tammany Parish Courthouse in the Third Ward in the Town of Covington, Louisiana, and that Mrs. J. C. Burns, Mrs. Eugene Wharton and Mr. Percy Barcell are hereby appointed commissioners, and Mr. Charles L. Smith clerk of said election, and that said election shall be conducted under the laws of the state applicable thereto.
Section 4. The President of this board is hereby instructed to give notice of the special election here noted, by a proclamation published according to law, and in said proclamation he shall announce that at ten (10) o'clock a. m., on Friday, Aug. 19, 1921, this board will meet at its usual meeting place in the Town of Covington, Louisiana, and in open session proceed to open the ballot box, examine and count the ballots in number and amount, examine and count the returns, and declare the results of the election.
On roll call the following members voted in the affirmative: Dutseh, O'Keefe, FitzSimons, Levy, Talley, Evans, Keller, Baneks, Sebastian and Oswald. The following members voted in the negative: None. And the resolution was adopted.

Dear Miss Lansing:—I will appreciate your letting it be known thru your branch of the Red Cross that I have been appointed Dental Examiner for ex-service men and women for the Parish of St. Tammany.

If a patient desires to have dental work done and has a claim number he should write to "Supervisor, Sixth District, U. S. Public Health Service 309 Audubon Building, New Orleans, La., attention of Supervising Dental Surgeon," requesting treatment. If he has no claim number he should write to same address, requesting a copy of Form 526. All work is done to benefit ex-service men, and is paid for by the U. S. Government. Men and women who have been in any branch of the service—soldiers, sailors, marines, army and navy nurses may make application for dental treatment.

Your immediate attention to this will be greatly appreciated.
