The following resolution was introduced by Mr. Talley, who moved its adoption, and seconded by Mr. Levy:

Whereas, in the opinion of this Board it is necessary and advisable that a special election be ordered to be held in School District No. 5 of the Parish of St. Tammany, La., at which there shall be submitted the following proposition:

To incur debt and issue bonds to the amount of \$60,000 to run not longer than twenty years from date, and to bear interest not exceeding 5 per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, for the purpose of constructing and furnishing a public high school building and purchasing a site, if necessary, for the said school building within said School District No. 5, title to which shall vest in the public.

Therefore be it resolved by the St. Tammany, La., School Board, in legal session convened, as follows:

Section 1. That a special election be and the same is ordered to be held in School District No. 5 in the Parish of St. Tammany, La., on Tuesday, October 4, 1921, at which there shall be submitted the following proposition:

To incur debt and issue bonds to the amount of \$60,000 to run not longer than twenty years from date, and to bear interest not exceeding 5 per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, for the purpose of constructing and furnishing a public high school building and purchasing a site, if necessary, for the said school building within said School District No. 5, title to which shall vest in the public.

Section 2. That the secretary of this Board be and he is hereby instructed to have prepared for use at said special election, a sufficient number of ballots on each of which shall be printed the proposition mentioned in Section 1 of this resolution, and in the following form:

To incur debt and issue bonds to the amount of \$60,000 to run not longer than twenty years from date, and to bear interest not exceeding 5 per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, for the purpose of constructing and furnishing a public high school building and purchasing a site, if necessary, for the said school building within said School District No. 5, title to which shall vest in the public.

Signature of Voter. To vote in favor of the proposition submitted upon this ballot, place a cross (X) mark in the square after the word "Yes." To vote against it place a similar mark after the word "No."

And, that the Secretary of the Board be and he is hereby instructed to have prepared for use at the said special election all necessary ballot boxes, tally sheets, lists of voters, and compiled statement of voters in number and amount.

Section 3. That the polling place for said election shall be at the usual polling place of the Fifth Ward of the Parish of St. Tammany, La., and W. H. Kahl, W. W. Hays, T. A. Sharp are hereby appointed commissioners, and Theo. Talley, clerk of said election, and said election shall be conducted under the laws of the state applicable thereto.

Section 4. The president of this Board is hereby instructed to give notice of this special election, hereinafter ordered, by his proclamation to be published, according to law, and in said proclamation he shall announce that at 10 o'clock a. m., on Friday, the 7th day of October, 1921, this Board will meet at its usual meeting place in the Town of Covington, Louisiana, and in open session proceed to open the ballot box examine and canvass the returns, and declare the results of the election.

Ordering a special election in Navigation District No. 1, St. Tammany parish, Louisiana, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the said Navigation District the question of a bond issue of \$25,000.00, the proceeds of said issue to be used to dig a channel at the mouth of Bayou Casting; to construct a revetment for the protection of said channel; to build wharves and make all necessary and proper improvements along said Bayou, in order to make said Bayou sufficient in size to receive and accommodate barges, schooners, motor boats and every other kind of vessel.

Whereas, it is necessary and desirable that funds be raised for the purpose of digging a channel at the mouth of Bayou Casting; constructing a revetment for the protection of said channel; building wharves and making all necessary and proper improvements along said Bayou, in order to make said Bayou sufficient in size to receive and accommodate barges, schooners, motor boats and every other kind of vessel; now, therefore

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of Navigation District No. 1 of St. Tammany Parish, Louisiana, That a special election be and the same is hereby called to be held in the Fourth Ward of the Parish of St. Tammany, Louisiana, on the 10th day of October, 1921, at which shall be submitted the following proposition, to-wit:

To incur debt and issue bonds therefor in behalf of Navigation District No. 1, of St. Tammany Parish, Louisiana, in the sum of \$25,000.00, to run twenty years from date and to bear interest at the rate of five per centum per annum from date and to be paid, payable annually or semi-annually, to dig a channel at the mouth of Bayou Casting; to construct a revetment for the protection of said channel; to build wharves and make all necessary and proper improvements along said Bayou, in order to make said Bayou sufficient in size to receive and accommodate barges, schooners, motor boats and every other kind of vessel.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, That the secretary of the said Navigation District No. 1, of St. Tammany Parish, Louisiana, be and he is hereby authorized and directed to have prepared for use at the said election a sufficient number of ballots, on each of which shall be printed the proposition above set forth

and in substantially the following form:

Ballot. Special election to be held in Navigation District No. 1 of the Parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana, on the 10th day of October, 1921, pursuant to an ordinance ordering same adopted by the Board of Commissioners of Navigation District No. 1 of St. Tammany Parish, as the governing authority of said Navigation District, on the 30th day of August, 1921.

Proposition to incur debt and issue bonds therefor in behalf of said Navigation District No. 1 of St. Tammany Parish, State of Louisiana, in the sum of \$25,000.00, to run twenty years from date and to bear interest at the rate of 5 per cent per annum, to dig a channel at the mouth of Bayou Casting; to construct a revetment for the protection of said channel; to build wharves and make all necessary and proper improvements along the said Bayou, in order to make said Bayou sufficient in size to receive and accommodate barges, schooners, motor boats and every other kind of vessel.

The Secretary of this Board is also directed to have prepared and to distribute to commissioners appointed to hold said election all necessary ballot boxes, lists of taxpayers entitled to vote either in person or by proxy at said special election, together with the valuation of property of each as shown by the last assessment approved and filed, and all necessary lists of voters, tally sheets and compiled statements.

Section 3. Be it further ordained, etc., That the polling place of said election, and the commissioners and clerks hereby appointed to hold said special election shall be in Mandeville, Louisiana, at the regular polling booth provided by law.

Section 4. Be it further ordained, etc., That the President of the said Navigation District No. 1 of St. Tammany Parish, Louisiana, is hereby directed to give notice of the said election hereby ordered to be held by his proclamation to be published according to law, and in said proclamation he shall announce that at eleven o'clock a. m., on the 11th day of October, 1921, the Board of Commissioners, as the governing authority of the Navigation District No. 1, will meet at its usual meeting place in the Town of Mandeville, and will, in open session, proceed to open the ballot boxes used at said special election, count the ballots in both number and amount, canvass the returns of said special election and declare the results thereof.
