Badon, Mayor of the Town of Covington, in the Parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana, in pursuance to a resolution passed by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of said Town on the 6th day of April, 1922, do hereby proclaim and give notice that a special election will be held in said Town for the purpose of voting upon the following propositions to incur debt and issue negotiable bonds of said Town to run thirty-five years, to draw interest at the maximum rate of 6 per cent per annum payable semi-annually, the proceeds of the said bonds to be used exclusively for the public improvement mentioned and designated in the propositions submitted to the electors herein. The propositions so submitted to the electors at said election are as follows:

Mr. C. E. Schonberg, seconded by Mr. M. P. Planche, offered the following resolution for adoption: Resolution of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Covington, Louisiana.

A resolution proposing to incur debt and issue bonds of the Town of Covington, in the Parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana, for certain purposes, and ordering a special election for the purpose of submitting to the property taxpayers of said town, the propositions for said purposes.

Section 1. AN ORDINANCE

Be it ordained by the Police Jury in legal session convened, That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to pile, stack or cord any material of any nature or kind on the shoulders of the public roads of the Parish of St. Tammany, or to drive any automobile, truck or vehicle of any kind across the ditch on either side of the roads of the Parish of St. Tammany.

Be it further ordained, That no person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof shall be fined in the sum not less than \$10 nor more than \$50, or imprisonment in the parish jail not less than ten days nor exceeding sixty days, or both, at the discretion of the Court.

Be it further ordained, That all laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith be hereby repealed.

Be it further ordained, That the ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage.
