both inclusive, 1927; Nos. 177 to 193, both inclusive, 1928; 194 to 211, both inclusive, 1929; Nos. 212 to 230, both inclusive, 1930; Nos. 231 to 250, both inclusive, 1931; all of said bonds bearing interest at the rate of five per cent per annum, payable semi-annually on the first days of April and October, except that interest for the period of April 1, 1922 to April 1, 1923, shall be payable on April 1, 1923, as evidenced by interest coupons attached thereto. Both principal and interest of said bonds shall be due and payable at the office of the Treasurer of Road District Number Two of the Parish of St. Tammany, in the Town of Covington, Louisiana, or at the Chase National Bank in the City of New York, at the option of the holder of said bonds or coupons; and said bonds shall be signed by the President of the Police Jury of the Parish of St. Tammany, and shall be attested by the Clerk of said Police Jury, provided, that the interest coupons may be authenticated by the facsimile signatures of said President and said Clerk. and surrender of the annexed coupons bearing facsimiles of the signatures of the President and Clerk of the Police Jury of the said Parish, as they severally become due. Both principal and interest of this bond are due and payable at the office of the Treasurer of Road District Number Two of the Parish of St. Tammany, at Covington, Louisiana, or at the Chase National Bank in the City of New York, at the option of the holder of this bond and of the several interest coupons.

This bond is one of a series of two hundred and fifty (250) bonds of like date, tenor and effect, except as to maturity, issued by Road District Number Two of the Parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana, for the purpose of constructing highways in and for the said Road District; and said Road District is hereby held and firmly bound and its full faith and credit are hereby pledged for the payment of principal and interest thereof at maturity.

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

Be it resolved by the Police Jury of the Parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana, That it is the desire and intention of this Police Jury to sell at a price under par and accrued interest and not less than ninety cents on the dollar and accrued interest, the certain \$250,000 par value of road bonds of Road District No. 2 of the Parish of St. Tammany, dated April 1, 1921, maturing on April 1 of each of the years 1923 to 1941, both inclusive, and bearing interest at the rate of five per cent per annum, in the event a bid of not less than par and accrued interest is not received; and that the President and Secretary be and they are hereby authorized and directed to cause to be advertised according to law for a period of thirty days the intention of this Police Jury to sell said bonds, and they are further authorized and directed to advertise said bonds for sale, in accordance therewith, on sealed bids to be received up to 12-o'clock noon on the 13th day of June, 1922.

Be it ordained by the Police Jury, in legal session convened, That all that part of the Parish of St. Tammany lying east of Pearl River, commencing at the mouth of Pearl River east of the Rigollets and Lake Shore to the southwest corner of section 11, tp 10 s, range 14 east; thence north of section line to the southwest corner of section 35 tp 7 s, range 14 east; thence east on township line to southeast corner of the southeast corner of southwest corner of section 31, tp 7 s, range 15 east; thence north through center of section 31 to 7 s, range 15 east; thence east on section line to corner common to sections 29, 32, 33 and 33, tp 7 s, r 15 east; thence north of section line to corner common to sections 21, 28, and 29, tp 7 s, r 15 east; thence east on section line between sections 21, 28, 22 and 27, tp 7 s, r 15 east, to west bank of Pearl River; thence down Pearl River to the place of beginning, shall constitute the Eighth Ward of the Parish of St. Tammany.
