

AN ORDINANCE. Be it ordained by the Police Jury in legal session convened, That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to pile, stack or cord any material of any nature or kind on the shoulders of the public roads of the Parish of St. Tammany, or to drive any automobile, truck or vehicle of any kind across the ditch on either side of the roads of the Parish of St. Tammany.

Be it further ordained, That any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof shall be fined in the sum of less than \$10 nor more than \$50, or imprisonment in the parish jail for less than ten days nor exceeding sixty days, or both, at the discretion of the Court.
