Furlow, Attorney, New Orleans, as special counsel in connection with the issuance of said bonds, and does hereby agree to pay him for his services heretofore rendered and to be rendered the sum of Twelve Hundred Fifty (\$1250) Dollars, said amount to be paid from the proceeds of said bonds when they are in hand; and the proper officers of this Police Jury and of said Road District are hereby authorized and instructed to draw a warrant for said amount to the order of the said Furlow when the proceeds of said bonds are in hand, without the necessity for further authorization by this Police Jury.


