GIVE THEM ROPE AND THEY WILL HANG THEMSELVES.

The farmer has so long been in the hands of the speculator that neither fear of God nor fear of man can break the speculator's habit of "doing the farmer up," and the farmer is so in the habit of being "done up" that he rushes his products to market every time the speculator baits him with his little advance sheet of market conditions.

New Orleans offers an example of this, to-day. Some 150 carloads of watermelons are rotting, while restaurants and stands are charging 15 and 20 cents a slice for them. Large melons sold as high as a dollar, while carloads rotted.

With fair dealing and protection of the farmer's interest, thousands of carloads of farm products could be shipped to New Orleans from nearby parishes. It was estimated that Washington and St. Tammany parishes would ship five or six hundred carloads of melons.




