CHARTER of the FOLSOM CIVIC LEAGUE, Folsom, Louisiana.

United States of America, State of Louisiana, Parish of St. Tammany.

Be it known, that on this the 16th day of October, in the year of our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, before me, J. C. Cappel, a Notary Public, in and for the Parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana, duly commissioned and qualified, and in the presence of the witnesses hereinafter named and undersigned, personally came and appeared the several persons whose names are hereunto subscribed, who declared that availing themselves of the laws of the State of Louisiana, relative to the formation of non-trading corporations, and particularly of Act 254 of 1914, of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana, they have united to form a corporation in accordance with the following articles, to-wit:

ARTICLE I. The name of this corporation shall be the Folsom Civic League, of Folsom, La., and by that name and title it shall exist and enjoy succession for a term of ninety-nine (99) years from the date hereof, unless sooner dissolved in accordance with law.

ARTICLE II. This corporation shall be a charitable institution, and its purpose shall be to promote charity and to foster the community spirit of the Town of Folsom, La., and to that end to erect, construct and operate parks, play-grounds, public assembly halls, swimming pools, community club houses, and to do all things which may be deemed necessary or properly incident to the conduct of a successful Civic League; and to assist and encourage the advancement of the material prosperity and progress of the Town of Folsom, and to aid in any and all charitable purposes conducted for the general welfare of the community. To these ends this corporation shall have power to contract, to accept and to acquire by grant, gift or purchase, lands, monies or other donations, to lease, hold and dispose of, and to mortgage and pledge the same, subject to such limitations as may be prescribed by law.

ARTICLE III. The domicile of this corporation shall be in the Town of Folsom, Parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana; and all citations and other legal processes shall be served upon its President, and in his absence, upon any one of its Vice-Presidents.

ARTICLE IV. All of the corporate powers of this corporation shall be exercised by a managing committee, composed of six members appointed by the President, from the active members; said committee shall elect their own chairman, and the President and Secretary shall be ex-officio members of this committee.

ARTICLE V. The said Managing Committee shall have power to create such committees as may be necessary for the proper administration of the affairs of the said Civic League, and in order to carry out the object and purposes thereof.

ARTICLE VI. The members of the Managing Committee shall be appointed annually on the twentieth day of September of each year.

ARTICLE VII. There shall be elected, annually, on the twentieth day of September, a President, First Vice-President, Second Vice-President, Treasurer and Secretary, who shall serve for the period of one year or until their successors shall have been elected and installed. The election of said officers shall be by ballot at a general meeting of the active members, held at the office of the said Civic League, after notice given in writing and mailed to each member at his last known address, at least ten days before the said election.

ARTICLE VIII. Each active member of the Civic League shall be entitled to one vote, which vote shall be cast in person.

ARTICLE IX. The managing committee shall have full power to make all by-laws, rules and regulations, and to fix all fees and charges for the privilege of using the amusements and facilities provided by this club.

ARTICLE X. The first Managing Committee shall consist of J. W. York, president; J. D. McLain, first vice-president; H. N. Fenderson, second vice-president; P. M. Reed, secretary; Miss Barbara McGowan, treasurer, and L. W. Stevens as member ex-officio, who shall serve until the 20th day of September, 1923, or until their successors are elected and qualified. The said Managing Committee shall have power to fill for the unexpired term any vacancies which may occur in this committee or any other committee appointed or selected under the provisions of this charter.

ARTICLE XI. Said managing committee shall also have the power to fill any vacancy occurring in the office of president, first vice-president, second vice-president, or that of treasurer or secretary.

ARTICLE XII. At all meetings of said managing committee three members, exclusive of ex-officio members present, shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE XIII. In lieu of shares of stock, the membership of the said Civic League shall be based upon a system of dues or contributions, coupled with or re-

lated to such other duties and qualifications as may be prescribed in the by-laws of said Civic League. The present membership dues are hereby fixed at fifty (\$50.00) cents for each member, per annum.

ARTICLE XIV. This corporation may be dissolved at any time prior to the limitations of its charter in the manner provided by law, and in case of its dissolution, its affairs shall be liquidated by a committee of five commissioners to be elected by and from the active members at a regular meeting called for that purpose, of which at least thirty (30) days' previous written notice shall be sent to each active member by the secretary.

Thus done, read and passed at my office in the Town of Covington, in the presence of Victor E. Planché and M. A. Lancaster, competent witnesses, who together with me, Notary, and the subscribers, sign their names to these articles of incorporation on the day, month and year first above written.
