

CHARTER of the FOLSOM CIVIC LEAGUE, Folsom, Louisiana. United States of America, State of Louisiana, Parish of St. Tammany.

Be it known, that on this the 16th day of October, in the year of our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, before me, J. C. Cappel, a Notary Public, in and for the Parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana, duly commissioned and qualified, and in the presence of the witnesses hereinafter named and undersigned, personally came and appeared the several persons whose names are hereto subscribed, who declared that availing themselves of the laws of the State of Louisiana, relative to the formation of non-trading corporations, and particularly of Act 254 of 1914, of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana, they have united to form a corporation in accordance with the following articles, to-wit:

ARTICLE I. The name of this corporation shall be the Folsom Civic League, of Folsom, La., and by that name and title it shall exist and enjoy succession for a term of ninety-nine (99) years from the date hereof, unless sooner dissolved in accordance with law.

ARTICLE II. This corporation shall be a charitable institution, and its purpose shall be to promote charity and to foster the community spirit of the Town of Folsom, La., and to that end to erect, construct and operate parks, play-grounds, public assembly halls, swimming pools, community club houses, and to do all things which may be deemed necessary or properly incident to the conduct of a successful Civic League; and to assist

and encourage the advancement of the material prosperity and progress of the Town of Folsom, and to aid any and all charitable purposes conducted for the general welfare of the community. To these ends this corporation shall have power to contract, to accept and to acquire by grant, gift or purchase, lands, moneys or other donations, to lease, hold and dispose of, and to mortgage and pledge the same, subject to such limitations as may be prescribed by law.

ARTICLE III. The domicile of this corporation shall be in the Town of Folsom, Parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana; and all citations and other legal processes shall be served upon its President, and in his absence, upon any one of its Vice-Presidents.

ARTICLE IV. All of the corporate powers of this corporation shall be vested in and exercised by a managing committee, composed of six members appointed by the President, from the active members; said committee shall elect their own chairman, and the President and Secretary shall be ex-officio members of this committee.

ARTICLE V. The said Managing Committee shall have power to create such committees as may be necessary for the proper administration of the affairs of the said Civic League, and in order to carry out the object and purposes thereof. The members of the Managing Committee shall be appointed annually on the twentieth day of September of each year.

rules and regulations, and to fix all fees and charges for the privilege of using the amusements and facilities provided by this club. ARTICLE VII. The first Managing Committee shall consist of J. W. York, president; J. D. McLain, first vice-president; H. N. Pendleton, second vice-president; P. M. Reed, secretary; Miss Barbara McGowan, treasurer, and I. W. Stevens as member ex-officio, who shall serve until the 20th day of September, 1923, or until their successors are elected and qualified. The said Managing Committee shall have power to fill for the unexpired term any vacancies which may occur in this committee or any other committee appointed or selected under the provisions of this charter.

Said managing committee shall also have the power to fill any vacancy occurring in the office of president, first vice-president, second vice-president, or that of treasurer or secretary.

At all meetings of said managing committee three members, exclusive of ex-officio members present, shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE VIII. In lieu of shares of stock, the membership of the said Civic League shall be based upon a system of dues or contributions, coupled with or related to such other duties and qualifications as may be prescribed in the by-laws of said Civic League. The present membership dues are hereby fixed at fifty (\$50) cents for each member, per annum.

The said committee with the consent of the president may increase or modify said dues from time to time, according to the needs and requirements of the said Civic League.

ARTICLE IX. This corporation may be dissolved at any time prior to the limitations of its charter in the manner provided by law, and in case of its dissolution, its affairs shall be liquidated by a committee of five commissioners to be elected by and from the active members at a regular meeting called for that purpose, of which at least thirty (30) days' previous written notice shall be sent to each active member by the secretary.

Thus done, read and passed at my office in the Town of Covington, in the presence of Victor E. Planche and M. A. Lancaster, competent witnesses, who together with me, Notary, and the subscribers, sign their names to these articles of incorporation on the day, month and year first above written.



AN ORDINANCE. Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Town of Mandeville, that a tax of ten (10) mills on the dollar be and is hereby levied on all property situated in the corporate limits of the Town of Mandeville, as assessed on the tax roll for the year 1922.

AN ORDINANCE. Levying a special tax for the sea wall.

Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Town of Mandeville, La., that the collector of the Town of Mandeville be and is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to collect for the year 1922 a special tax of 3 1/2 mills on the dollar on all property situated within the corporate limits of the Town of Mandeville as assessed on the tax roll of said town for the year 1922.

AN ORDINANCE. Levying a tax of two dollars (\$2) on each male inhabitant of the Town of Mandeville, La., between the ages of eighteen (18) and fifty-five (55) years, for the purpose of working and improving the streets of the town.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Town of Mandeville, La., in legal session convened, That there is hereby levied on all male inhabitants of the Town of Mandeville, La., between the ages of eighteen (18) and fifty-five (55) years of age, a per capita tax of two

(\$2) dollars for the year 1922 for the purpose of working and improving the streets of the said Town of Mandeville, La.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, That the per capita tax levied in Section 1 of this ordinance shall be due and collectible within ten days after notice given and that any person refusing to pay said tax, or working three days on the streets of the said Town of Mandeville, shall upon conviction before the Mayor, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than twenty-five dollars or to serve a term of not more than thirty days in the town jail, or both fine and imprisonment, at the discretion of the Mayor.

Section 3. Be it further ordained, That this ordinance shall go into effect immediately after its promulgation.
