

What They are Doing at Placerville.

PLACERVILLE, February 6th, 1865. EDITOR WORLD: According to notice, the Christian Sanitary Organization of this place, held their meeting this evening in "Bureka Hall," and our little town assumed a more lively appearance than it has for months past.

At 8 o'clock a large crowd had assembled in front of the hall, to witness the "Balloon Ascension," being entertained in the meantime by music from Oldsale's Brass Band.

After the balloon was inflated, it presented a beautiful appearance—being about twenty feet in length and eleven in diameter. A few moments past 8 o'clock, it was "cast off," when it arose almost perpendicularly about half a mile, then drifted to the north, but still keeping an upward course; when to the height of about two miles, it drifted back to the south again, where it remained in this position until the fluid was nearly consumed, when it commenced reeling like a drunken man, and finally settled to the earth, a few hundred yards from where it started.

It was soon captured and, on examination, found to have sustained but little injury in its tour through the air. It will again be inflated on Tuesday evening, Feb. 15th, at which time the Placerville Brass Band give the St. Valentine's Ball. The meeting was now called to order by Mr. M. B. Moore (our worthy P. M.), who is President of the Christian Sanitary Association of this place.

The Brass Band opened the music with the "Star Spangled Banner," and were followed by the Glee Club in the beautiful song of—"Gone, gone to the War." The constitution of the organization being read by Mr. Thomas Neally (the Sec'y), the Glee Club presented another of their beautiful pieces—"God Save the Nation." Hon. H. F. Crain, of Centerville, was then introduced, who addressed the audience in a very able manner for half an hour, being interrupted many times by the cheering of the crowd.

His remarks were very appropriate, and couched in such language that no one could take exceptions. Alternate music by the Band and Glee Club ensued for half an hour, during which time a collection was taken up by the Committee, for the benefit of the Association. The music selected for the occasion was very good and very appropriate. The songs of the Glee Club meeting with universal approbation, and particularly the "Swiss Bell Ringers," and "Jimmy was Drafted into the Army."

At the close of this song cheer followed cheer for a repetition, until the President called order, remarking at the same time that "A little laughter now and then, is relished by the best of men," when a voice in the crowd drawled out—"I'll warrant you." Mr. Flemming then favored the audience with the two favorite and truly beautiful ballads, viz—"Just before the Battle, Mother," and "Kindly greet the weary Soldier," accompanied by his instrument and a part of the Glee Club; and from the breathless stillness of the house, I can assure you they were well appreciated.

The house, though densely crowded, was very quiet during the singing and speaking, not a word was said to mar the harmony and pleasure of those present; and after the meeting adjourned, while the crowd were retiring from the house, the Glee Club were singing the appropriate little song—"Good Night." Two hundred dollars was collected for the Association, and everybody enjoyed themselves very much.
