STAMP ACT.

We are indebted to Mr. Thomas Ranney, Deputy Commissioner of Revenue for the Territory of Idaho, for an extract from the Revenue Act of February 8th, and the Commissioner's construction thereof.

Section 15 of the act of February 8, 1875, provides that a bank check, draft or voucher for the payment of any sum whatsoever drawn upon any bank, banker or trust company, shall be subject to a stamp tax of two cents.

By this enactment checks, drafts, etc., drawn on time are liable to stamp tax as well as those payable at sight, or on demand, as are also receipts or other vouchers taken by banks, etc., for the payment of money.

VERDICT OF CORONER'S JURY ON THE BODY OF JAMES THOMPSON.—We, the jury summoned to inquire into the causes of the death of James Thompson, find that deceased came to his death from the effect of a gun shot wound in the head, said wound being inflicted by himself, on the morning of the 29th of February, A. NEWS IN BRIEF.

The law adopted by the French Assembly for the organization of the Supreme legislative body, provides a Senate and Chamber of Deputies. The latter is alone authorized to originate finance bills.

A party of prospectors in the Black Hills report that they are prospecting with success. The February receipts of the Consolidated Virginia mine to date aggregate \$531,500.

The Pacific Mail Investigating Committee will recommend prosecutions for perjury against Schumaker and King.

Hon. A. G. Riddle has filed, in the District Law Courts, suits against the persons shown by the Ways and Means investigation to have received money belonging to the Pacific Mail Company to lobby the subsidy bill through Congress.

Dispatches have been received announcing the final signature of the terms of settlement of the Virginian question, and it is probable that the Alfonso Government will be speedily recognized by the United States.

Judge McKean ordered in the case of Ann Eliza Young vs. Brigham Young, to the effect that within ten days from service of order against defendant Brigham Young shall pay to counsel for plaintiff \$3,000 attorney's fees, and within twenty days pay plaintiff \$9,500, accumulated money at the rate of \$500 per month for alimony and divorce, and \$500 on the 10th day of March, and the same sum on the first day of each succeeding month thereafter.

In the Senate the House bill for the admission of Colorado into the Union as a State, with a Civil Rights Constitution, was passed—ayes, 43; noes, 13; also, House bill for the admission of New Mexico: same terms—ayes 31; noes, 11.

Richard B. Irvin, of Pacific mail fame, has fled Washington to avoid criminal process charging embezzlement of the Company's funds.

Newton Booth has resigned his position as Governor of California and gone to Washington to take his seat in the United States Senate.

A Madrid telegram says that the war against the Carlists will be ended, the coming spring. It is stated that 300 troops recently deserted from the Carlist army and that 50 of them were recaptured and shot.

The locomotive works at Scranton, Pa., with valuable machinery, were burned Sunday.

The amount of the Spanish indemnity in the Virginian affair is \$80,000.

In a recent attack of Carlist troops of Bilbao, two forts were taken and retaken three times.

Troubles with the Pennsylvania coal miners are on the increase. They are burning company's property.

The majority of the French people are in favor of a Constitutional Republic, and the monarchs are determined to have the throne or war.

The Civil Rights bill has passed the Senate by a vote of 38 to 26.

March 3, 1875.

Death is always trouble, come how or when it may; but when man becomes so lost to reason as to seek his own destruction in a moment of frenzied insanity it is indeed sad and painful.

James Thompson was an old and much respected citizen of the basin. A little more than a year since he became intrusted in the saloon business in this place, and was one of the heavy losers by the fire last fall, but had rebuilt and was doing apparently a good business, always jovial and happy, with a pleasant word for all.

He kept on and on until frenzied by his ill luck, he ended his own existence. It was a fault "it was a grievous one, and grievously has he answered it." Let us draw the mantle of charity, bury it with him, and speak now only of his virtues, and let his tragical end, though sad indeed be a warning to us all.

A warmer heart than his never beat in the breast of man. Though now called in death his many good qualities will long be remembered, though a foreigner by birth and no immediate relatives to follow his remains to their last resting place.
