Summer School

The annual Territorial Summer School will be held at the Normal School, Honolulu, July 3 to July 28, 1916 (20 days). Regular teachers' examinations will be held during the first week of August.

No tuition fee will be charged. Candidates must be at least eighteen years of age. Candidates not in the public school service are expected to have at least passed the eighth grade final examinations. Opportunity will be given for candidates to take the eighth grade examinations at schools when there is an eighth grade. This department should be notified, however, by those wishing to take the examinations.
