

LIHUE LIGHT BILL AGAIN APPROVED

(Special Washington Correspondence of THE GARDEN ISLAND.)

Washington, D. C. May 12—The Senate Committee on Pacific Islands today reported favorably the bill S. 5777 as follows:

The Committee on Pacific Islands and Porto Rico, to which was referred the bill (S. 5777) to authorize and provide for the manufacture, maintenance, distribution, and supply of electric light and power within the Lihue and Koloa districts, county of Kauai, Territory of Hawaii, having had the same under consideration, report it back to the Senate with the recommendation that it do pass with amendments indicated below.

This is a bill to authorize a company to supply and distribute electric light and power in two districts on the island of Kauai, also known as the county of Kauai, Territory of Hawaii.

The entire population in these two districts is less than 10,000 people, and there is no prospect of any considerable increase.

This franchise contains a clause which expressly reserves to Congress the right to amend or repeal the bill, and furthermore provides that the franchise is not to be construed as being an exclusive one.

It is also provided that the company shall be subject to the rules and regulations of the Public Utilities Commission of the Territory. Also, that after the lapse of 20 years the plant may be purchased by either the Territory of Hawaii or the county of Kauai.

An electric-light service would be a desirable and proper convenience for this small community and would make for greater public improvement.

Volcano Observatory


