Hughes Begin Campaign

New York—Mr. Hughes, the Republican candidate, made his speech of acceptance last night and took occasion to rap the Wilson administration very hard. The speech was delivered in Carnegie Hall before a huge crowd. Mr. Hughes made a plea for firmness and more consistency, and denounced all plots and conspiracies fomented in the United States in the interest of any foreign nations. The third year of the great war begins and finds the real crisis still ahead. The speaker scored Wilson's Mexican policy.

German Captures Britisher

Berlin—An auxiliary cruiser, after an engagement with an armed British steamer off the Norway coast, captured it.

Fighting Along All Lines

London—Fierce fighting continues on all battle fields. The Russian drive closes in on Kovel, the key to the German lines on the east front. Allied forces on the Somme front are moving forward.

Zeppelins Raiding English Coast

Zeppelins are raiding the east and southeast coasts of England. A British aeroplane fired numerous shots into one of them.

Immigration Bill Deferred

Washington—The Immigration Bill has been postponed until the next session of Congress at the request of Democratic members of Congress.

Damaging Evidence Procured

San Francisco—The police broke into the headquarters of a suspect gang here and secured letters and other documents which the district attorney says will make convictions in the dynamiting case certain. The documents shows vast ramifications of a frightful conspiracy. Convictions will send both men and women to prison, says the district Attorney.

Irish Question Unsettled

London—Parliament is in a heated debate over the failure of the government to disclose its plans in regard to Ireland, which indicates that the Irish question is still far from settled.

The Military Bill

Washington—The House balks at the Senate amendments to the military bill, which greatly increases the amount of appropriations, and sends the altered measure to conference.

Deutschland May Sail Today

Baltimore—The indications are that the German subsea freighter will make a sudden dash today for the open sea.

Monday Afternoon

New York—Albert Dickman, agent for the Lehigh Valley Railroad, and Alexander Davidson, superintendent of warehouses for the National Storage Company, have been arrested under the startling accusation of guilty participation in the blowing up of the Storage Company's warehouses at Communipaw, New Jersey, at 2 o'clock Sunday morning.

The men have been charged with manslaughter and the police and detectives who have been working on the case since an hour after the explosion occurred declare that they have every reason to believe the two men were largely responsible for the deal.

A Federal investigation is also progressing. United States secret service men have been put on the trail of what may prove to be an astounding plot. City and State officials are also conducting inquiries in an endeavor to ascertain the cause of the explosion and find out what men, if any, were involved in bringing about the disaster.

Pope's Appeal Fruitless

Rome—The appeal of the Pope for peace is without result and the fighting will go on.

Germans Attack In Force

Paris—North of the Somme river the Germans have launched a furious attack and have redoubled the strength of their counter attacks. Between Henwood and Monaco farm a severe struggle is going on.

British Advance Position

London—The British advanced their posts on the west front today at some points north of Bazentine le Grand.

Mexicans Again Cross Border

El Paso—A gang of Mexican bandits crossed the border near Fort Hancock in the early hours of this morning and received a hot welcome from a detachment of cavalry on guard near the spot at which the outlaws entered American territory. The gang was virtually wiped out, but in the encounter two Americans were killed and one wounded.

Henderson Gets One Year

Honolulu—A. T. Henderson, bookkeeper of the von Hamm-Young Company, entered a plea of guilty to the charge of embezzling money from his employers and was sentenced to imprisonment for one year. Henderson is a well known young man in the city.
