

The Kamehameha Schools

IN THE GARDEN ISLAND of January 30 appeared an "open letter" from Rev. J. M. Lydgate to the president of Kamehameha Schools. Since then a reply has reached Mr. Lydgate, and he has kindly turned it over to this paper in order to "round out" the subject. The letter of Principal Webster is as follows:

Honolulu, T. H., Feb. 1, 1917.
Mr. J. M. Lydgate,
Lihue, Kauai.

Dear Sir:

In these days when unpleasant notoriety and considerable adverse criticism seems to be the lot of the Kamehameha Schools, an expression of appreciation such as your open letter dated January 22nd, is received as a very welcome surprise.

We do believe in giving the Hawaiian boys and girls all the musical training possible, consistent with other things which are perhaps more vital. You may be interested to know that the music of the schools this year is in general charge of Miss Ruth Muzzy, a graduate of the Yale Music School, whose training is, I believe, superior to that of her predecessors here, and she is, I feel, doing just as good if not better work than that which has made former pupils helpful in the various communities in the Territory. We are also now working on plans for the enlargement of our chapel and the installation of a new organ which should further the pupils' familiarity with an appreciation of good music.

I said above that we considered some other things more vital than good music and, despite much talk to the contrary, think that the Schools are progressing in the training of Hawaiian and part-Hawaiian boys and girls to be independent, self-reliant and self-respecting citizens of the Territory. You speak of what the graduates are doing in "a musical way" in the little country places. These are the places where I hope to see more of our graduates going from year to year rather than remaining in Honolulu. Only a very small beginning in this direction has yet been made, but in the past year, the Boys' School has sent two young men to sugar plantations on Hawaii, where, according to all reports, they are doing well. This must certainly be true in one instance for a few days before your letter of good cheer was received, a request from a plantation manager to whom one of these boys went, for another, was very encouraging. The work here, I feel, is and will continue to be for years to come, a large one, and, in spite of adverse criticisms immensely worth while.

Ordinance No. 9.

AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE AND CONTROL THE TRIMMING AND CUTTING OF TREES, BUSHES AND PLANTS LOCATED ON THE PUBLIC HIGHWAYS, AND LANDS OF THE COUNTY OF KAUAI, TERRITORY OF HAWAII.

Be it ordained by the people of the County of Kauai, Territory of Hawaii.

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any persons firm or corporation to cut down, remove, trim out, chop or clip the limbs or branches from any tree, bush or plant when such trees, bushes or plants are located on or growing upon the roads or public highways of the County of Kauai, or are located on or growing upon any land owned or leased by the County of Kauai without the written consent of the Board of Supervisors of the said County of Kauai, first had and obtained.

SECTION 2. Any person, firm or corporation that violates the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be punished by a fine of not more than Twenty Dollars, nor less than One Dollar.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall take effect at the expiration of ten days from and after its publication. Approved the 7th. day of February, A. D. 1917.

Ordinance No. 10

AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE AND CONTROL THE UPKEEP, MAINTENANCE, RELOCATING AND EXTENDING OF TELEPHONE, TELEGRAPH, AND ELECTRIC LIGHT POLES WIRES ETC. AND PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION OF SAID ORDINANCE.

Be it ordained by the people of the County of Kauai, Territory of Hawaii.

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to place build, set up, erect or construct any telephone pole, telegraph pole, electric light pole, or any apparatus or contrivance for the purpose of transmitting electric power or electric current, or for carrying or transmitting telephone messages or telegraph messages in or upon the roads or the highways of the County of Kauai, Territory of Hawaii or upon any land owned or leased by said County of Kauai without the written consent of the Board of Supervisors of said County of Kauai, first had and obtained.

SECTION 2. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation who, or which at the date this ordinance goes into or takes effect has, and maintains any telephone poles, telegraph poles or electric light poles, or any other contrivance or apparatus for the purpose of transmitting electric power or electric current, or for carrying or transmitting telephone messages or telegraph messages in or upon the roads or public highways of the County of Kauai, Territory of Hawaii to remove, relocate or change the positions of such and said poles, telephone poles, telegraph poles or electric light poles, or such and said other contrivance or apparatus for the purpose of transmitting telephone messages or telegraph messages without the written consent of the Board of Supervisors of said County of Kauai, first had and obtained.

SECTION 3. It shall be unlawful for any person firm or corporation who, or which may, at any time in the future from the date this ordinance goes into or takes effect, have or maintains any pole, telephone poles, telegraph poles, or electric light poles, or any other apparatus or contrivance for the purpose of transmitting electric power, or electric current, or for carrying or transmitting telephone or telegraph messages in or upon the roads or public highways of the County of Kauai, Territory of Hawaii to remove, relocate or change the positions of such and said poles, telephone poles, telegraph poles or electric light poles, or such and said other contrivance or apparatus for the purpose of transmitting electric power or electric current or for carrying or transmitting telephone messages or telegraph messages without the written consent of the Board of Supervisors of said County of Kauai, first had and obtained.

SECTION 4. Any person, firm or corporation that violates any of the provisions of the foregoing ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and punished by a fine of not more than One Hundred Dollars, nor less than Ten Dollars.

SECTION 5. This ordinance shall take effect at the expiration of ten days from and after its publication. Approved the 7th. day of February, A. D. 1917.


