

BY-AUTHORITY
PROCLAMATION OF
COUNTY ELECTION

WHEREAS it is provided by law that an election of County Officers shall be held and take place on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in the month of June, 1919, in the County of Kauai, Territory of Hawaii, and the officers then elected or elected at the Primary preceding said General Election, as by law provided, shall take office on the first day of July following said General Election and shall hold office until their successors are elected and qualified:

AND WHEREAS it is further provided by law that a Proclamation for a County General Election shall be issued and posted by the Board of Supervisors at least thirty days before a General Election:

NOW, THEREFORE, in accordance with the provisions of the law in that behalf made, the undersigned, Board of Supervisors of the County of Kauai, hereby give notice and proclaim that a General County Election will be held in the County of Kauai aforesaid for the election of County Officers as hereinbelow named for the said County of Kauai on TUESDAY, JUNE 3rd, 1919, between the hours of eight o'clock a. m. and five o'clock p. m. of said day, namely:

- ONE SUPERVISOR FOR WAIMEA
- ONE SUPERVISOR FOR KOLOA
- ONE SUPERVISOR FOR LIHUE
- ONE SUPERVISOR FOR KAWAIAU
- ONE SUPERVISOR FOR HANAIEI
- ONE COUNTY SHERIFF
- ONE COUNTY CLERK
- ONE COUNTY AUDITOR
- ONE COUNTY TREASURER
- ONE COUNTY ATTORNEY

It is further proclaimed that each of the Supervisors is to be elected by the qualified voters of each district within the said County of Kauai.

The precincts and polling places established or as may be established by the laws of the Territory of Hawaii for the election of Representatives in the 6th Representative District, being the County of Kauai, shall constitute the precincts and polling places for the election of County officers.

At such time and places aforesaid, the undersigned Board of Supervisors of the County of Kauai hereby call upon all duly qualified voters of the County of Kauai to meet for the purpose of electing such County Officers aforesaid and as required by law.

Notice is hereby given that all fees for licenses, except fees for Hunting Licenses, are due and payable on July 1st, 1919.

All applications for Licenses must be accompanied by certificates showing the payment in full of delinquent taxes.

All applications for licenses for the manufacture of Food Products, Restaurant, Hotel and Boarding House, Beef Butcher, Slaughter and Sell, Pork Butcher, Slaughter and Sell, To Sell Beef, To Sell Pork, To Sell Milk, Livery Stable, Barber, and Dyeing and Cleaning must be accompanied by Board of Health Certificates.

All applications for Auctioneer and Beef Butcher, Slaughter and Sell, Licenses, must be accompanied by Bonds.

All applications for merchandise Licenses must be accompanied by affidavits showing amount of gross receipts during the fiscal year prior to July 1, or statements showing the commencement of any trade or business for which such Licenses are required.

All those carrying on a business as co-partnership must file a statement of co-partnership, showing residence of each partner, firm name, and the place of business of said co-partnership, verified as true by one of the partners.

In case of change in the co-partnership or dissolution, notice of such change or dissolution must be filed with this office.

Applications for a passenger license must be accompanied by certificate of the Inspector.

Death of H. W. Knight

News has just been received of the death of H. W. Knight in Honolulu yesterday. Mr. Knight was for many years a resident of Nawiliwili, during which time he commended himself so thoroughly to all who knew him that he left behind a great many very devoted friends. Mr. Knight was born in London, and from there as a young man went to New Zealand. Later he took up homesteading in Kansas, but found the climate too severe for him and came to the islands for his health. For some years he was manager of the historic Nolte restaurant, then the best in Honolulu. From there he came to Kauai as bookkeeper for C. W. Spitz, where he remained until his health failed him and he had to give up work.

A modest, retiring man, a great many who knew him only in a casual way did not realize what a fine man he was, and did not credit him at his full worth. He was one of nature's gentlemen, by instinct and education; a man of superior intelligence; of many refined and gentle qualities, as well as the soundest and most reliable integrity. Many friends will lay a simple flower on his grave.




