SAME OLD STORY WITH MAKEE

Henry Sheldon's green and white team, otherwise known as the Makees, again triumphed on Sunday at Kapaa in the crucial game of the season. "Talking" Tilly and the McBrydes falling by the wayside to the tune of five to zero, exactly the same score by which Lihue lost to the champions last Sunday. Only a miracle can now stop the Kapaa lads from copping the gonfalon again this year, as they only have four games more to play before the season ends and all these games are considered easy for them, with the possible exception of the last Lihue game at Lihue.

Only two hits of a scratchy nature were secured off Cummings, one coming in the first inning on a hard chance to Tsunehiro by E. Watase and another in the 7th by Tilly which took a bad bound over the shortstop's head. Not a single McBryde player reached third until the 7th and only got two that far during the entire game, indicating the airtight defense of the Makees. It was a pitchers' battle with Cummings outpitching Tilly. Cummings struck out nine and walked three while Tilly walked one and struck out six. He allowed four hits, two of which were infield taps beaten out.

For the Makees, stars were many, Cummings being mostly in the lime-light. Although charged with one error, his speed in covering first on Tilly's bunt in the 9th was very timely and his two-bagger in the third inning started the rally which put the kibosh on McBryde. Yoshida in center caught a hard chance with a man on base in the 5th. Doi contributed a time single which scored Cummings from second in the 7th. Tsunehiro at short had a fine day grabbing everything in sight and "Flat" Ahana at second more than made up for his miscue in the 7th when he picked up Kamaka's "grass cutter" and threw him out at first with two on bases. Rodrigues and Soong suffered a drop in their batting average, but played a great game in the field. Hee fielded the difficult corner without error but King in left had nothing to do. For McBryde, it must be conceded that Tilly pitched as well as he ever did, the Makee's hit column showing this, but he simply did not have the support needed to win, and only three of the Makee's five runs were earned. Tilly also fielded well and secured half of his team's hits, but his efforts were in vain.

The Makees scored three times in the 3rd. Cummings opened up with a double to right center. Doi grounded to Kamaka and both were safe or a fielder's choice. Ahana bunted and Cummings scored when Gabriel, after tagging Cummings, dropped the ball. Hee bunted safely, making it bases full with no down. Tilly then tried a bit of strategy and walked Tsunehiro. Makee's heaviest hitter, to get at Soong, forcing in run number two. Soong grounded to second, forcing Tsunehiro, but Ahana scored on the play, making it three to nothing. The Lucky Seventh put the game on ice for the Makees. With Rodrigues gone, shortstop to first, Yoshida beat out a slow roller to third and went to second when G. Watase threw wild to first, although too late. Antone Perreira booted Cummings' grounder and Yoshida beat it home. Doi singled and Cummings scored the last run of the day.

McBryde had a great chance to score in the 7th. A. Perreira walked but was caught stealing. Tilly's grounder bounded over the shortstop's head. Ako grounded to third, but Ahana dropped Hee's throw and left both runners safe. Gabriel sacrificed but Kamaka grounded out second to first. Another chance to save a fate identical to Lihue's last Sunday came in the 9th after two down. Ako was at bat with Spalding on third, but he fanned and McBryde's hopes for the 1921 championship went glimmering.
