

innocent victim of his good character (far more precious than wealth) and therefore is guilty of something worse than robbery. In the words of Shakespeare, "he that filches from me my good name, robs me of that which not enriches him, and makes me poor indeed." Is the secret dagger of the mid-night assassin more to be dreaded than the busy tongue of the slanderer?

The murderer though great indeed his crime, is in some degree exposed to danger, and stakes something in accomplishing his horrid purpose; but the slanderer, secure from any opposition, secretly deals the death-blow to the character of his fellow-man, damns him in the estimation of those who know him, blasts his prospects for life, and makes him undeservedly odious to the world. The murderer destroys the mortal part of man, the slanderer murders "that immortal part the reputation;" and in small degree in my humble estimation, is he guilty, who, though he may not himself speak slander, yet with greedy ears, favours every false report that may be circulated about his neighbors.

If in the few remarks now set forth, I am found to be too severe, I have the satisfaction of knowing that I have erred on the right side. That there is too much slander dealt out in this small community, needs not my assertion to make evident. These remarks (though poor indeed) will all arouse the attention of persons to the serious nature of the offence against individuals and society, committed by those who deal in false invective and thereby use slanderers and backbiters to be frowned down by the better disposed part of the community, I shall be much more happy.

HONESTE HONORABILIS.

It has ever been our wish to oblige all who favor us by communications, and we rarely refuse to print them, even when the matter may not altogether agree with our own views. In the present instance we partially coincide with the opinions of our correspondent, and deeply regret the necessity which should occasion so severe a censure. We have no confidence, however, in the hope that newspaper paragraphs, or appeals to the better feelings, will stop a practice which is so sure and so safe a method of revenge, or of kindling prejudices, to those whose fears or malice keep them like a asp in his covert, always ready to eject their poison upon the unwary. Thoughts, which if uttered openly, "would cause the blood from coward lips to fly," when whispered in secret, like guilty actions done under cover of darkness, betray no blush of shame. If there are any of this community which God forbid to whom these remarks apply, we fear they are like that individual, who had become so notorious for mendacity, who to have apparently lost all distinction between truth and falsehood. When desired to reform, he plead from long habit his utter inability; but as a ray of hope for him, he is urged to commence by telling *one truth* daily.
