Notes From Fiji.

Our wintry season delayed its advent to a most unprecedented extent this year, and consequently there has been an unusual amount of influenza and bronchitis of an obstinate character. At last, however, our cool south-easters have set in, driving the objectionable north-easterly away, and everybody is on the mend.

But the weather which has been so unfavorable to the comfort of humanity has had the best effect on the crops of all kinds. The copra returns continue large, the sugar output will be well up to mark, tobacco is looking up, and the time-expired coolies are beginning to turn out in their settlements crops of rice of far finer grain than any we can import. It is asserted by them that the soil and climate have improved on the seed, and certainly the product appears to endorse that statement; at all events they evidently believe in it, for within 30 miles of Suva they are putting in over a hundred acres of it, and Government is erecting here a small holler for experimental purposes.

Our banana plantations are returning steadily to their normal prolific condition, the silt deposited by the floods beginning now to compensate for the damage done at the time. New plantations are being opened up, and the demand in New Zealand for Fiji fruit is rapidly increasing, without any diminution in price but rather an advance. Some time since the Government, at the instance of the now moribund agricultural association, sent for some plants of the Gros Mitchell variety, which is cultivated so largely in West India for the New York market. Yesterday the first ripe bunch was tried here, and there is no doubt that it is a fine fruit, quite equal to and hardly to be distinguished from our best China bananas (as they are called here) in appearance or flavor. An important question is how far it will be able to resist disease.


