ANARCHISTS IN VIENNA.

Discovery of a Great Plot Against Austrian Royalty. VIENNA, Sept. 28.—On the 23d inst. the Associated Press cabled exclusive information of the arrest of a number of Anarchists in this city, in a house on the Siebenbrunner strasse, and the discovery of cases of revolvers, bombs, explosives, coats with leather linings, with hooks for suspending bombs to them, and documents of a most incriminating nature.

The rival news agencies have been trying to belittle this news, and the police have been most reticent in regard to the matter till to-day, when they admitted the truth of the story and added material facts, showing the conspiracy was the greatest since Guy Fawkes' day. They say subsequent investigation shows the Anarchists intended to smuggle dynamite into the underground portion of the Reichsrath building, and, when that body met October 10th, blow its sky high and strike terror into the hearts of the enemies of the independent group of Socialists, to which the arrested men belonged.

Had the plot succeeded some 600 people would have been buried into eternity, including princes of the imperial family, hereditary nobles and dignitaries of the church. The Anarchists also had plans laid to blow up at the same time the Town Hall, with over a thousand employed therein, beside a number of important buildings on the Ringstrasse, one of the finest streets in Europe, the University, the famous Historical Museum and other buildings of a similar nature. The Hotburg Theatre was also included in the conspiracy.

The strangest part of the story, as far as the United States is concerned, comes now. The Associated Press has already announced the bombs made according to the formula of Herr Most at New York, but this is not all. The police claim to be able to prove the Anarchists in this gigantic conspiracy are connected with the Anarchists at Chicago. They say this is not merely a police theory, but the connection of the Chicago Anarchists with those here has been fully established beyond a doubt. Correspondence between the Chicago Reds and those of Vienna is said to be in the hands of the Austrian Government, who, it would seem, must have communicated with the Chicago police on the subject.

VIENNA, Sept. 28.—The excitement over the discovery of the Anarchist plot is still at fever heat. Four Anarchist workmen were arrested to-day, and more arrests are hourly expected. A large number of those known to be connected with Anarchistic societies has hastily left the city. All the public buildings are carefully guarded by the police. These precautions will be continued as long as Parliament is in session. The police are in possession of facts of the greatest interest to the police of several European capitals as well as Chicago and New York. They decline to divulge the particulars, but it is known they have established beyond a doubt connection between the Austrian plotters and the Anarchists of Chicago and New York.

BOMB-THROWING IN SPAIN. An Attempt to Murder General Campos at Barcelona. BARCELONA, Sept. 25th.—While General Campos was reviewing the troops yesterday a wild looking man threw two bombs at him. One fell among the staff officers and the other fell underneath the horse on which the General was astride, shattering the animal's legs and tearing open its stomach. The General fell, partly stunned. He staggered to his feet, and mounting the horse of an aide-de-camp ordered the review to proceed. He could not remain long on horseback, for a wound he had received forced him to take a carriage, from which he continued to review the troops, the crowd cheering until they were hoarse.

The name of the bomb-thrower was ascertained to be Pallas. He is a notorious Anarchist, and when questioned concerning the crime he defiantly admitted that he intended to kill General Campos and staff. He will be promptly tried by court-martial, and may be shot within twenty-four hours. At the bomb-thrower's residence a mass of anarchistic literature was found and letters also fell into the hands of the police which led to the arrest of two more anarchists who are said to be accomplices. The bombs used were large iron spheres charged with dynamite, and the explosion was so powerful that it broke the windows in a house a long way from the reviewing point, and caused a stampede in which many persons were injured.
