

AT A SPECIAL SESSION.

THE COUNCILS ASKED FOR AN EXTRA SUBSIDY.

The Provisional Government Will Pay Half the Expense of Sending the Australia Off.

A special meeting of the Executive and Advisory Councils was called to order at 2 o'clock this afternoon by Acting President Hatch. The following members were present: Ministers King and Damon, the Attorney-General, and Councilmen Ena, Waterhouse, Allen, Emmeluth, Tenney, Young, Morgan, Bolte and Suhr.

Seven individuals, charged with selling liquor without a license, had their hearing remanded until tomorrow; also one chap for assault and battery.

Three Japanese, charged with gambling, pleaded not guilty. The court heard the evidence from both sides and found them all guilty.

Nagata and Ogata, two Japs, charged with aiding and abetting five others who had been arrested for gambling to escape from the custody of the police, occupied the attention of the court for the balance of the morning session, and their case was taken up again at 1:30 P. M.
