MINISTER WILLIS SPEAKS.

Minister Willis paid a visit to the President and Cabinet this morning and remained twelve minutes.

It was impossible for our reporters or for the management of the STAR to learn what occurred at the interview. That the proceedings were of grave importance is to be inferred from the promptness with which a call was made upon the Council to assemble.

It is possible that the news will be given to the STAR to-night, in which event, if not too late, an extra will be issued. The stenographic report of what Minister Willis announced to the Executive Council has been type-written.

A rumor circulates as we go to press that as soon as the reply of the Foreign Office is received by Minister Willis the Corwin will carry it to the Coast and return with advices from Washington.

PROPOSED ADJUSTMENTS.

It is pleasant to have the assurance of Minister Willis that he is at work upon a plan to settle the Hawaiian trouble in a way that is honorable and which will satisfy all parties at interest.

If the new plan involves a compromise with Royalty on a basis which continues even the semblance of Royal power or state on these Islands, it will be labor lost. The contest of January 17th has gone beyond a dicker over rulers or constitutions.

If the plan at hand is a buying off of the claimant to the throne, with money to be supplied by the United States, that is none of our business. Should the American Government wish to purchase a commodity which is undeniably for sale, well and fair.

OUR STRENGTH IN CONGRESS.

The number of United States Senators now in office is 88, of which 44 are Democrats, 39 are Republicans, and 5 Populists.

The 39 Republicans stand solidly against the restoration of the ex-Queen of Hawaii by United States forces. So do Senators Peffer and Kyle of the Populists and Senators Morgan and Faulkner of the Democrats.

It is claimed, however, that Senators Hill, Murphy, Gray and White are opposed to restoration. We are unable to find that the former have declared themselves, and as for the latter they are quoted both ways.

In the House the Democratic majority is very large, 212 to 137. Little has been heard as to where its members stand, though it is significant that Judge Holman, the Democratic leader of the House, has declared against the restoration scheme.

It is obvious, however, that the Senate, as it stands, can tie up any action, adverse to us, which the House may take; and it is to be inferred that it can wholly defeat any legislation of the kind which the President's well-known views may lead him to devise or suggest.

The movement of the public and the Councils to rid the civil service of the ex-Queen's friends has come to an abrupt pause. It is true that the dangers which threaten us have drawn public attention from the Royalists in office; but as those dangers are increased by the presence of disloyal men behind the breastworks, it is time that such attention was again focussed.

TREMENDOUS MISTAKE.

Col. Robert G. Ingersoll, who came over to Boston to lecture on "Shakespeare" at the Boston Theater last night, said to a Globe reporter who asked him what he considered the most important question of the hour:

"Well," replied the Colonel, "the subject that is uppermost in my mind just now is Mr. Cleveland's action in regard to the Sandwich Islands."

"I should say I had! I see that President Cleveland is going to take the word of a Democrat who was not in Hawaii at the time of the dethronement of Liliuokalani rather than the word of a Republican who was there and saw it all. The Democrat who don't see knows more, of course, than the Republican who does."

"I believe President Cleveland is making a tremendous mistake. I had hoped the United States would acquire the Sandwich Islands by honorable means."

"There's another phase of the question. I don't believe Mr. Cleveland has the shadow of right to take such action as is proposed without the consent of Congress. He exceeds his powers in sending the United States navy out there on any such errand purely on his own responsibility."
