The St. Louis College managers and teachers are enjoying the gratification of seeing that their work has accomplished good results.

In a note to THE STAR a settler on Hawaii suggests that instead of leasing the Government grant for simple titles and become a mortgagee.

Within the space of sixteen months four large, well attended and representative gatherings dealing with problems of municipal reform have been held in the United States.

The oft-expressed regret that there were not enough officers to go around seems to have been based on a mistaken impression. Some of the places, however, are without salary.

It is now held that under the Constitution neither an officer in the volunteer militia nor a Citizen's Guardsman can accept any other commission from the Government. This length seems absurd.

In the Bishop premises on Emma street the Board of Education secures an almost ready made High School if the pending transaction can be carried out. The building will require but slight alteration and the grounds are among the finest in the city. The over crowded condition of the present High school building makes the demand for another place imperative.

No LIMIT was placed on the scope of legislation in the call for the special session. There are two excellent reasons however, why caution should be exercised in this direction. The first is that there will be a regular gathering in February next and that this one should be brief on that account. In the second place nothing should be undertaken that will affect the most careful and painstaking consideration of the act relating to public lands.

A vigorous crusade against the free coinage of silver is to be carried on by the New York Chamber of Commerce. That body intends to extend its efforts so as to cover every section of the country, and for the purpose of its propaganda it has appointed a special committee of representative men in almost every line of business represented in the metropolis. This committee is to direct the line of attack to be adopted against all forms of "cheap" or fiat money.

THE Advertiser says it wants the report of the special committee on Mr. Castle's nomination made public. This sounds very much like a "great big bluff." If it is earnest, Mr. Castle is one of the few men who invite treatment of the nature of being run down by a cable car, rushed over by a cavalry company, fired from a cannon or dropped from a balloon. If he gets what he says he is after he will enjoy the felicity of to some degree seeing himself as others see him.


