ALL ALONG THE DOCKS

NEW BOILER AND REPAIRS ON THE JAMES MAKEE.

Mikahala for Kauai—Irmgard Gone With Sugar—Albert Waiting—S. C. Allen Delayed.

The bark Albert is waiting for sugar at Irmgard wharf.

The steamer Kauai will sail tomorrow at 4 p. m. for Kilauea.

The steamer Mikahala will have a big passenger list for Kauai this trip.

The barkentine W. H. Dimond is topping off her cargo at the Oceanic wharf.

The S. S. Coptic will be due from San Francisco tomorrow, but may drop in this evening.

The schooners Kaulikenui, Ka Mo'i and Mo'i Wahine are expected daily from Hawaii. They are all in the Allen & Robinson line.

The barkentine Irmgard sailed this morning for the Coast with a full load of sugar. Capt. Schmidt expects to make a good run up.

The steam roller was engaged on the W. G. Hall's wharf this morning leveling off. The Hall will dock there on arrival this afternoon.

The steamer Waialeale will make two trips this week. She will return from Kapaa on Thursday morning and leave again in the afternoon.

The steamer Iwalani will come off the Marine railway tomorrow morning and will sail on Thursday for Lahaina, Kahului and Honokaa.

The bark S. C. Allen received sugar from the steamer Kauai yesterday and today. The Allen will not get away for some time yet, Capt. Thompson being engaged on the Gainsborough wreck.

The steamer Mikahala will leave for Kauai ports at 5 o'clock this evening. Her new machinery is just about beginning to work smoothly and the Inter Island people are looking for a record breaking trip.

The exports by the barkentine Irmgard today were as follows: 8566 bags sugar, F. A. Schaefer & Co., 8599 bags sugar, C. Brewer & Co., 268 bags sugar, Castle & Cooke and 781 case pineapples, Hawaiian Fruit & Packing Co. Domestic value \$62,635.40.

The steamer James Makee had her new boiler placed in position yesterday afternoon. She will also receive a new bowsprit in addition to her other repairs. The steamer Waialeale assisted in the work of getting the boiler in, and sailed shortly after for Kauai.


