### COMMITTEES ARE ACTIVE.

They Have Arrangements Well in Hand for the Fourth.

W. H. Hoogs was chosen grand marshal of the day on the Fourth of July by the general committee, which held a meeting in the Drill Shed last evening. Mr. Hoogs will choose his own aides.

As the natal day falls on Sunday, the committee has decided to hold the celebration on the date that will be proclaimed by the President. It is extremely likely that Saturday, July 3, will be the day.

The committee on fireworks, through its chairman, J. A. Kennedy, reported that the display would take place in the harbor from sews which would be equi-distant from the present moorings of the Philadelphia, the can buoy and Brewer's wharf. Trophies will be offered for the best illuminated ships in the harbor, and fully twice as much money would be expended on this feature of the celebration.

The parade this year will be about the same as last year. Maj. McLeod, chairman of the committee on bands, parades and salutes, stated that the men-of-war in port at that time will probably participate in the parade and an invitation would be extended to the two Japanese gunboats which will be anchored here then, to take part. The Fire Department will turn out with elaborate decorations.

Another Fine Run from Lahaina, Passengers and Freight.

The Mauna Loa arrived from Hawaii and Maui ports soon after noon, after another fine run. Barring the stop at Kaunakakai, where the boat was detained for nearly twenty minutes, the run from Lahaina was made in less than six hours.
