SCHOOL SITE SELECTED

VARIOUS MATTERS BEFORE THE BOARD OF EDUCATION.

There Will Be No Holiday on the 24th—School Lots Wanted for Court House—Application for Position.

The Government will build a court house at Koloa, Kauai. The Executive has written to the Board of Education, requesting that the school lots be exchanged for two other lots in Koloa owned by private parties and which are suitably located for the court house. The matter was left entirely with the Minister of Public Instruction.

Deputy Inspector General Scott reported at yesterday's meeting of the Board that he had accompanied Manager Ahrens over the lands belonging to the new Oahu plantation in search for a school site. He had discovered some school land about three-eighths of a mile from the projected mill site and would establish a school there.

The Board had a long discussion on the matter of declaring a holiday in the Government schools on Queen Victoria's birthday, which comes on Monday next. The Deputy Inspector General wanted a precedent established in the matter of closing the schools on such occasions. The Board decided that unless the Executive promulgated a holiday that the schools should open. As the Executive has not declared the Queen's birthday a public holiday, the schools will not close on that day.

It was stated by Mr. Scott that a cost of \$1200 had been estimated as enough to move the school and cottage at Waianae to Pearl City and build an additional veranda. He also stated that the ground was too badly broken up to move the buildings to Waipio. The Board was offered \$400 worth of lumber for the buildings at Waiawa, he said. This school is inconvenient for the children and the Board has decided to change the location to Pearl City.

In the matter of the Hodson children, who are attending the High School, it was voted to ask Principal M. M. Scott if he would recommend a free scholarship for these children. Minister Cooper remarked that were it not that the Fort street school is crowded, pupils from the High School unable to pay for their tuition, could be sent there, as both schools are about equal in efficiency.

The Teachers' Committee had no report to make.

The application of Professor W. D. Thompson of Dayton, Ohio, was placed on file.

Two petitions asking that Mr. Callow be reinstated as principal of the Government schools on Molokai, were referred to the Teachers' Committee for investigation.




