ALL ALONG THE DOCKS

MARIPOSA ARRIVES FROM THE COAST.

Waialeale and Ke Au Hou Bring in Sugar—Naniwa Takes in Coal—The Louisiana Sails Tomorrow.

The Island discharged coal oil today.

The Mariposa took 300 tons of coal at this port. Two hundred tons of coal were taken by the Naniwa this morning.

The Alden Besse has moved down to Sorenson's wharf, where she will discharge.

The bark Albert will likely sail on Monday, July 11. She will wait for a full load of sugar.

The Transit finished discharging her bricks this morning and will begin taking sugar at once.

The ship Louisiana will get away tomorrow morning for Port Townsend. She goes in ballast.

Capt. Harry Evans picked up three deserters from the ship Louisiana this morning and returned them aboard ship.

The Kilauea Hou will sail at 4 this afternoon for Hawaii ports. Among her shipments is a big lot of lead piping for Kawaihae.

Having taken sugar at the Nuuanu Nuanu wharf, the Aryan moved into the stream this morning to await further arrivals from the plantations.

The Waialeale arrived early this morning from Lahaina with 3500 bags of Pioneer mill sugar for H. Hackfeld & Co. She will sail again tomorrow afternoon for Kauai ports.

The Ke Au Hou arrived this morning from Hamakua with 3940 bags of Honokaa sugar for F. A. Schaefer & Co. She will probably be returned on the same route tomorrow.

The O. S. S. Mariposa, Capt. Hayward, arrived at 7:45 this morning. She sailed from San Francisco, at 2 p. m. of the 24th, and had pleasant weather all the way down. She sailed at 2 p. m.
