ALL ALONG THE DOCKS

HARD LUCK STORY OF A PORT TOWNSEND SKIPPER.

The Lena L. Makes an Unexpected Call—Alameda In Port—Gossip of City Front.

The C. C. Fink is discharging coal at the Mail dock jog.

The Waiialeale was docked in the new slip this morning.

The Palmyra will finish discharging today. She will return to the Sound.

The Government tug Elen is on the marine railway receiving a scraping and painting.

Repairs on the Matilda are almost completed, and she will be in sailing trim by the time her cargo is out.

The Waiialeale arrived from Lahaina this morning with 3200 bags of sugar, which will go into the Alameda.

The Iolani will sail for the Orient today with a cargo of oil, scrap iron, and rocks. Capt. McClure will have two passengers.

The four-masted barkentine J. I. Stanford sailed from Newcastle for this port on the 16th ult., and the bark Woolohia on the previous day.

The Hesper will not go on the railway this trip, as Capt. Sodergren does not think he can afford the time. She has taken in ballast and will sail tomorrow morning for the Sound.

The Mary L. Cushing has received 35,000 bags of sugar at the railroad wharf. On Friday she will be hauled over to the Mail wharf, where her cargo will be topped off from the warehouses.

The Roanoke has now 52,280 bags of sugar in her, but needs 20,000 more. As she must wait on steamers to secure the remainder of her cargo, it is improbable that she will be ready for sea before the latter part of next week.

The S. S. Alameda, Capt. Van Otterdorp, arrived from the Colonies this morning, a full day ahead of her time. She left Sydney on the 5th, Auckland on the 10th, and Apia on the 14th. The Alameda brings an unusually large consignment of freight, and will take out about 4000 bags of sugar. She will not sail until 10 o'clock tomorrow morning.

The Lena L., a tiny schooner commanded by Capt. Krellberg, put in here this morning to land a sailor who was ill. According to her log she cleared Port Townsend 42 days ago, ballast, for the Mexican coast, with a crew consisting of the Captain, mate and cook. The mate became ill, and Capt. Krellberg came in here as the nearest port, to secure medical aid. The little schooner has been becalmed off the islands for 17 days, according to the Captain's story. Despite his misfortunes, the skipper appears to be very cheerful.
