ALL ALONG THE DOCKS
THREE SAILING VESSELS SAIL IN BALLAST.
Roller Recovered at Eleele—The Oregon May Not Come—Gossip of the Day on the City Front.
The Alameda sailed on schedule time.
The Iolani has been delayed another day, but will get away this afternoon for Hongkong.
The bark Matilda will finish discharging tonight, and will be ready for sea about Saturday.
The Mowera is the next steamship expected. She is due to arrive from the Colonies on Saturday.
The bark Palmyra will sail this afternoon in ballast for the Sound. The Hesper, bound in the same direction, sailed at noon.
Capt. Sanders, the pilot, sailed for San Francisco on the Alameda this morning to bring home his wife, who is very ill there.
The bark Kosciusko is loading coal at Newcastle for this port. She is a wooden vessel of 1192 tons, and her master is Capt. Rodd.
With the Iolani, Hesper, Palmyra and Matilda out this week, and the Cushing, Irmgard and C. C. Funk next, the harbor will be pretty bare.
Capt. Benhu returned on the Mikahala this morning from Eleele, where he successfully raised the 7-ton roller lost there during the rough weather some months ago. It was a big job, but was accomplished without accident.
The Mikahala and James Makee arrived from Kani ports this morning, the former with 5129 bags of sugar, and the latter with 2544 bags of sugar and 100 bags of rice. The Mikahala's sugar goes into the Rannoke, and the Makee's into the Irmgard, which is the only coaster now loading sugar.
There are a few skeptical old salts who do not take any stock in the story that the Oregon has been ordered here. They say that the Oregon could not be brought into the harbor if she did come. They suggest that the only way to prepare for the reception of the monster is to dredge out the harbor and move the town back.
