BIG EXPORTS OF WHEAT.

The wheat crop of 1897 is moving seaward at a rate that is breaking all previous records. Within seven days five cargoes with a total of 481,737 bushels, valued at \$431,512, have cleared from Portland and are now on the way to England. A cargo of flour cleared for the Orient included 19,188 barrels, valued at \$78,830, bringing the value of wheat and wheat products for the week up to over half a million dollars.

INVITED TO BRUSSELS.

The United States government has been invited by the Belgium government to send a representative to the eighth international congress of navigation, which will be held at Brussels in July, 1898. The congress will discuss important questions of maritime and inland navigation.

ARE TO MEET CANAVARRO

FEW PORTUGUESE WHO WANT TO GO TO TIMOR.

According to the Consul General there will not be a General Migration of the Colony.

Senhor Canavarro, Portuguese charge d'affaires and consul general, has invited a few of the Portuguese colony, who have expressed a desire to emigrate to the Island of Timor, to meet him at the consulate on Beretania street tomorrow morning.

Consul General Canavarro will lay before these people the correspondence which he has received from the home government relative to the matter. The government of Portugal does not offer much encouragement to the colonists here to go.

The Portuguese Consul General in an interview today gave a full history of the facts leading up to the communication which he has just received from his government. Senhor Canavarro said:

"Some little time ago a half dozen two or three of them being in business, heard of the good success attained in coffee cultivation, I believe, on the Island of Timor. They wrote to the Governor of the Island asking for information concerning the Islands and asking for advice upon their migration to the Island. The Governor of Timor referred the letter from these colonists to the general government of Portugal, and it is the reply to this communication that I have just received."

Senhor Canavarro was asked for a verification of the articles published in J. M. Vivas' paper, The Luso, this morning, to the effect that fully one thousand Portuguese in Hawaii would leave for Timor in the event of annexation carrying, because they would not have the privilege of voting should Hawaii become United States soil.

"There is no truth in it as far as I know," came the reply. "Only a half dozen Portuguese to my knowledge have signified their intention of going. I am quite sure that the immigration will not be general and possibly no one will go at all."

The Island of Timor is southeast of Java and northwest of Australia, and about a day and a half steaming from Batavia. The Portuguese and the Dutch own the island jointly, it being ruled by a Portuguese governor. Timor is well populated. Coffee is the principal industry.
