**EXCEEDED ALL ESTIMATES**  
 KONA, OLAHA AND HAMAKUA  
 PLANTERS HAPPY.

Many Interesting Items From Hilo—  
 Latest News From the North Hilo  
 and Kona Districts.

The Japanese colony in Oloha held  
 a luncheon at 18 miles on Saturday eve-  
 ning.  
 Work on laying the water service  
 for Puna has commenced.  
 A few light earthquakes were felt  
 in Hilo last week.  
 The L. D. Foster with one million  
 feet of lumber is now landing on the  
 Coast for Hackfeld & Co., at Hilo.  
 Deputy Land Agent E. D. Baldwin  
 is in the Oloha district to catch up with  
 the survey work that has accumulated  
 so rapidly with the rush of set-  
 tlers in the district.  
 The sight of the heavy seas dashing  
 against the cliffs out along the planta-  
 tions north of Hilo has been a very  
 grand one during the week, and many  
 people have gone out to view it.  
 Mr. Roeha, the tailor, claims the  
 distinction of being the first on these  
 Islands to employ electricity for iron-  
 ing and pressing clothing. He has a  
 flat iron heated by electricity which  
 works like a charm.  
 Mr. Gray of Papaikou, who accepted  
 the clerkship of the Hilo office for the  
 Wilder Steamship Company, has now  
 changed his mind about the same, and  
 Mr. Beckley will engage a clerk in  
 Honolulu for this office.  
 Mr. Vanatta has been elected chief  
 and Allen Wall assistant chief of the  
 Hilo fire department.  
 Bookkeeper W. D. Schmidt of Hono-  
 mahu has gone to Germany in search of  
 health.  
 Manager Rothwell of Peacock & Co.  
 states that his firm will build a new  
 block at the corner of Waiannene  
 and Bridge streets, which will be a  
 top-notch job.

The solution of the extension of  
 Bridge street through the Church  
 property will doubtless be found in  
 an exchange with the right of  
 way for a piece of Waiannene street  
 north of Hilo Hospital, which same  
 must be arranged for the coming legis-  
 lative session.  
 The Tribune learns from nearly every  
 coffee district on the island that  
 the estimate made two months ago as  
 to the quantity of this year's product  
 will be realized and very much ex-  
 ceeded in almost every instance. The  
 weather has been perfect, ripening  
 has been slow and berries are filling  
 out remarkably.  
 The building boom is gaining head-  
 way every day in Hilo. The lumber  
 yards are unable to fill orders, not-  
 withstanding the unusual arrival of  
 ship load after ship load.  
 During Manager Kennedy's recent  
 visit to San Francisco he placed an  
 order for a new tugboat for the Wai-  
 kea plantation.  
 Sheriff Andrews returned to Hilo  
 Saturday with a gruesome chapter of  
 accidents and suicides from around  
 and about the island. He first was  
 called to investigate the death of Ah  
 Pai, out in Waimea, who it was found  
 committed suicide. The same day a  
 Japanese working on the new road in  
 the Laupahoehoe district while tick-  
 ling out rock from a ledge 300 feet  
 above the sea was struck on the head  
 by a falling stone. He fell down on  
 the narrow ledge, and eyewitnesses  
 say his body violently writhed over  
 the edge down that frightful depth,  
 300 feet, into the sea.

**KAU DISTRICT NUGGETS.**  
 Mr. Lesser of M. Phillips & Co., and  
 Mr. Waldron of McChesney & Sons,  
 were in the district this week.  
 Pahala mill has shut down for the  
 season. Preparations are being made  
 for the introduction of a new mill en-  
 tirely.  
 Kau has at last received the long ex-  
 pected rain. On Wednesday and  
 Thursday of last week over eight in-  
 ches fell at Nanehau. During the  
 present week high cold winds from  
 the mountains have prevailed.

**SHEEP RANCH FLOURISHING.**  
 August Granberg was in Hilo last  
 week and informed the Tribune that  
 the property of the Humuulu Sheep  
 Station, of which he is the manager,  
 is a particularly flourishing condition.  
 The wool crop of 1896 was 76,000 lbs.,  
 and he believes he will increase it to  
 over 100,000 lbs. this season. He has  
 fully 300,000 acres to pasture off, and  
 confines the same to sheep and hor-  
 ses. He has been attracted by the  
 present prices paid for horses in Hilo,  
 and proposes to send in some of his  
 stock, which are of the best work an-  
 imals grown on the islands.


