WATER FREIGHT GOING UP

KLONDIKE IS THE CAUSE OF IT ALL.

Enormous Charters Refused and Vessels Not for Sale at Any Price—The Brokers in a Quandry.

Shipping conditions in San Francisco are today as they have never been before, and next spring promises to bring with it a problem to which nobody pretends at present to offer a solution, says a recent San Francisco Chronicle. The Alaska excitement is primarily responsible, but the enormous grain crop and the consequent utilization of a large number of ships has aggravated the situation very considerably.

Freight rates all around have gone up with a jump. It is next to impossible to purchase a vessel of any kind in the local market and ship brokers are in despair at their inability to charter anything at all at any figure.

All the vessels of the Alaska Packers Association will be withdrawn from the coal carrying trade as soon as the spring opens, and these, with every other available vessel in port will be used in transporting passengers and provisions to the new gold fields. It is greatly feared that it will be impossible to maintain Dutch Harbor, Oondaska and St. Michael, as coaling stations, for the reason that there will be no means of transporting the coal to these points. The matter of getting lumber to Dyea is already a serious problem, and freight from coast ports to that point has gone up to \$10 a thousand feet.

The spring sugar trade, the trade between here and Siberia and China, the Alaska salmon trade, will all suffer, it is feared, owing to this scarcity of tonnage. Shippers who three months ago refused to pay 30 shillings, now find no one to accept offers as high as 50 shillings, and even the passenger companies are lying low, and waiting to size up the situation better before agreeing on their rates to Alaska. An offer was made recently to one of the largest local transportation companies for a block of fifty tickets to Alaska, but was absolutely refused consideration.

The Alaskan season will be short, and for this reason the number of the boats for which occupation can be found is unlimited. There is a prospect of some improvement in the present means of travel in that country, and if by any device the roads to Dawson, for provisions as well as passengers, can be kept open for any extended period the present high rate will rule until it is time to ship next year's grain crop, when the same condition of affairs will probably be repeated and continue as long as Alaska holds out its present golden promises.


