ALL ARE AMERICAN TROOPS

NO STATE DISTINCTIONS WILL BE RECOGNIZED.

Tennesseans Resident in Honolulu Will Give Their Organized Effort to the Committee of One Hundred.

At a meeting of Tennesseans and men from neighboring states held in the Chamber of Commerce yesterday afternoon to provide some special entertainment for the Second Tennessee regiment while in Honolulu, a prominent business man voiced this sentiment:

"I love a Tennessean, but I love an American more; I love Tennessee, but I love the United States more." The expression met hearty responses right and left, with the result that the body voted to provide no specific "headquarters" for Tennesseans or any one else, but would help to make Honolulu a "headquarters for Americans."

In the house was a veteran of the Confederate service in the Civil war. He was first and foremost in his objections to any scheme that would provide specific entertainment for any state or section of the country. "From Maine to Florida and from Florida to the Pacific coast, we are one, united and strong," said he, "and we do not want even the semblance of a dividing line anywhere."

The Tennesseans will be shown special courtesies here, but not by organized effort. A number of residents know officers and men of the regiments, and will heartily receive them personally. But the sense of the meeting was that they should, in a general way, fare the same as the men from Minnesota, Kansas and Dakota, who perhaps have fewer friends, fewer acquaintances and will be less able, on that account, to take care of themselves.

The Tennessee regiment by the way contains 1,200 men. It comes from the neighborhood of Nashville. Colonel Smith and several other officers were through the late war. In fact the regiment was also in the struggle from first to last.


