Charles Touch, a brand new amateur from San Diego, will ride in the second bicycle meet at Cyclonere on Saturday evening.

The fourth expedition will leave San Francisco previous to the 10th inst. The fifth and last expedition will leave in August.

The Pacific Transfer Co., T. C. McGuire, manager, with office on Hotel street, opposite Arlington Hotel cottage, has a card in this issue.

The Oceanic steamship Alameda will not be seized by the United States for transport service and will leave San Francisco on schedule time.

A religious meeting was held in the Y. M. C. A. hall last evening in honor of the two Christian Commission men now here on their way to Manila.

A semi-annual meeting of the trustees of the Queen's hospital will be held at the rooms of the Chamber of Commerce on Saturday, July 9, at 10 o'clock a. m.

Miss Eckardt and James Lino will be married at the Catholic church at 7 o'clock tomorrow morning. The bride is the daughter of the superintendent of the Queen's Hospital.

AMONG THE TROOPS.

The Minnesota troops have liberty all of today. They came over in small boats.

Early this morning the regulars of the Eighteenth and Twenty-third went out to the baseball grounds for drill. They returned to their respective vessels at 10:30.

The Idaho regiment was given a shore leave at 12 o'clock. Same for the Dakotas. Upon their return to the vessel they formed and were all marched to the grounds of the Executive building and were feasted by the committees.

The Wyoming troops have had general leave today and are spending the time looking over the town.

The Astor battery and regulars on the Newport were given shore leave to 6 o'clock this afternoon.

The feast on the grounds of the Executive building began at 1 o'clock this afternoon. It is being carried out on the usual lines. The special troops being entertained are the Idaho, Dakota and regulars, who were not ashore yesterday.

MURAT HALSTEAD ILL.

Murat Halstead, the famous politician, editor and historian, is in the city.

He arrived by the Newport this morning. Since leaving San Francisco, Mr. Halstead has been suffering with a slow fever, and soon after reaching Honolulu was transferred from the ship to the Queen's Hospital, where he now is and likely to be for some days to come. He will not proceed with this expedition, and, if improvement does not soon occur, he may return from here to the States again.

Mr. Halstead is the historian of the Manila expedition. He goes with the sanction of President McKinley, from whom he bears letters, and is authorized to prepare for the public a history of all the military events in the Philippines.

FINE HORSES BURNED.

Tom Hollinger's stable at Kapiolani park was consumed by fire about 10 o'clock last night and four valuable horses perished in the flames, Penniyaya, Margaret H. and Gerster were among them. The third horse was a young carriage mare of great promise.

Margaret H. and Gerster are known to every one on the local track. The other two horses are new.

Besides the horses the following were burned: A large stable, eight sets of harness, \$150 worth of horse boots, a surrey, a piano box buggy, \$250 worth of feed and other stable material.
