**TWO HORRIBLE DISASTERS**

**BRIDGE OVER THE ST. LAWRENCE COLLAPSES.**

Trolley Cars at Cohoes, N. Y., Struck by a Special Train—Fifty Human Beings Killed.

HOGANSBURG, N. Y., September 6.—At about noon today two south spans of the International bridge of the New York and Ottawa railway, now under course of construction over the St. Lawrence river, three miles above the St. Regis Indian village, fell without warning. Eighty men at work on the bridge were thrown into the river sixty feet below. Over thirty were picked up and taken to Cornell hospital, and twenty-seven are now missing.

COHOES, N. Y., September 5.—An appalling disaster occurred in this city tonight. Shortly before 8 o'clock a trolley car of the Troy City railway was struck by the night special of the Delaware and Hudson at a crossing at the west end of the Hudson river bridge, which connects the city with Lansingburg, and its load of human freight was hurled into the air. Eighteen of the thirty-five passengers are dead, and at least ten of the remainder will die.

**TROUBLE IN CRETE.**  
Unexpected Mussulman Uprising Due to Race Hatred.

CANDIA, Island of Crete, September 6.—Candia is in a state of anarchy. A collision between the Mussulmans, who were demonstrating against European control, and the British authorities, who have been installing Christians as revenue officials, culminated today in bloody fighting between the Mussulmans and the British troops. Riots took place in various parts of the city and many have been killed.

When the outbreak was fiercest a warship stationed in the harbor began firing shells, with the result that a portion of the city is in flames. The greatest confusion and uproar prevail, and it is feared that the night will not pass without further pillage and destruction.

The trouble began with the attempt of the British military authorities to install Christian officials. They had appointed a council of internal control to administer the title revenues and a detachment of soldiers was stationed outside the office as a precaution.

A crowd of unarmed Mussulmans, who had been demonstrating against the Christians, attempted to force an entrance into the office.

The British soldiers fired and wounded several. The Mussulmans ran for their arms, and, returning, attacked the soldiers. Other Mussulmans spread rapidly through the Christian quarters shooting into windows and setting many houses and shops on fire.

It is reported that the British consul has been killed.

CANEA, September 6, via Paris.—Four warships have started for Candia. Special precautions are being taken here, and at Retimo troops are being held in readiness.

LONDON, September 6.—It has been known that the Mussulmans were discontented at the joint rule of the powers in Crete. This was largely due to the fact that they were confined in the towns, while the Christians were allowed the liberty of the island. But the rising of the Mussulmans was unexpected.

The Cretan fleet is under command of the French Admiral, Pottier, as the senior officer, and consists of British, French, Russian, Italian and Austrian ships, Germany having recently withdrawn from participation in the joint control or government of Crete.

The Turks set fire to the whole town of Candia.


