CITY OF COLUMBIA.
A Second Attachment Issued at T. H. Davies & Co.'s Suit.

A second attachment was issued against the City of Columbia today. The order for it was issued by Judge Perry on the libel of Theo. H. Davies & Co. for \$5,486.76 due on a bottomry bond given October 27th.
The bottomry bond was given as security for money advanced to enable the vessel to sail from here for Seattle, she having been then tied up with process pending the final disposition of the Colegrove, Berliner and other suits against her. At the same time that the bottomry bond was given, a sight draft was given T. H. Davies & Co. on A. H. Soelberg of Seattle for the amount advanced. The draft was neither accepted nor paid, but was protested. T. H. Davies & Co. therefore seek by this proceeding against the vessel to protect themselves for the money advanced on her behalf.

THE ROB ROY.
A couple of Japanese have bought the old, almost dismantled schooner Rob Roy. They are overhauling, repairing and rebuilding her upper works in the basin near the old fish market wharf. It is understood that it is their intention to put her under a native skipper and crew and put her in the Island trade.
