PLAY THAT WINS BY A NOSE

AN EPIDEMIC OF CYRANO DE BERGERAC.

A Dramatic Episode That has Taken Complete Possession of the Mainland and Obscured Trilby's Feet.

CHICAGO, November 26.—Trilby's feet have gone into eclipse, or the snug hosiery of forgetfulness. Cyrano Bergerac's nose is now the test subject by which you test your acquaintance's up-to-dateness. The man who can't tell you all about it and hasn't some original opinions of his own on the subject, is either a suburbanite to whom catching trains is the whole of life, or else is one of those superior individuals who doesn't read the newspapers, but waits for the quarterly reviews to keep him posted on what the world is doing.

"Cyrano de Bergerac" is a character created in a play of the same name by the great French comedian Coquelin. It went to London in an English translation, and there both Augustin Daly and Charles Frohman got hold of it. Daly produced it in Philadelphia, playing up Ada Rehan as "Roxane" as the star. Frohman produced it in New York with Richard Mansfield in the role of Cyrano.

This Cyrano is a man of parts, but with a most grotesque nose. This distraction from the normal exterior of what is looked for in a man of his excellence leads him, in self defense against the pity and commiseration of his friends and acquaintances to make a virtue of it. He affects a roystering character and makes all sorts of sport of his own disfigurement.

The character of Cyrano itself, as presented in the play, is enough to make "le nez terrible" talked about. But the rivalry between Frohman and Daly and the professional pique between their respective "Stars," has accentuated it, till the Cyrano nose has become a more important theme than the policy of expansion or what we shall do with Cuba. The periodicals from the monthly magazines to the housewives' journals are full of it. Serious articles are written discussing the relation of the nose to art with most recondite allusion and reference to well known statues and paintings in which the nose is something other than normal. The dramatic side of the nose question is discussed in an equally serious fashion.

The cartoonists and artists for the humorous papers have taken it up and the Cyrano nose greets you in every illustrated paper you take up. The paragraphs on the papers have seized on that nose with avidity to point their morals and adorn their tales. The humorists of the funny papers have found in it a subject which rivals in fecundity of application the mother-in-law joke. Here is a specimen which may serve as an indication: "This Cyrano de Bergerac must be a sporting play."

"A sporting play?" "Yes, it seems to have won by a nose." Cyrano de Bergerac companies are springing up all over the country. There isn't a barn storming theatrical circuit from Maine to Texas that hasn't at least one, and if they win, "it's by a nose."


